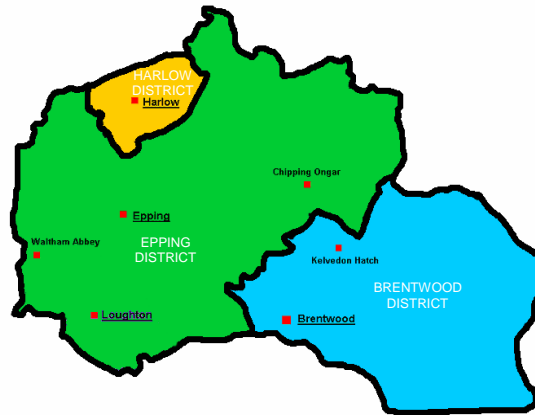
Neighbourhood policing is about the police being responsible and accountable for specific geographic areas. It is also about listening to the concerns of residents, allowing local people to assist in the setting of neighbourhood policing priorities, responding to these concerns with actions co-ordinated with other partner agencies and the community, and finally reporting back to the community on the progress made.

Each District will now have a Chief Inspector based at the local station that will be responsible for delivering neighbourhood policing and ensuring that policing is delivered to the highest standard.

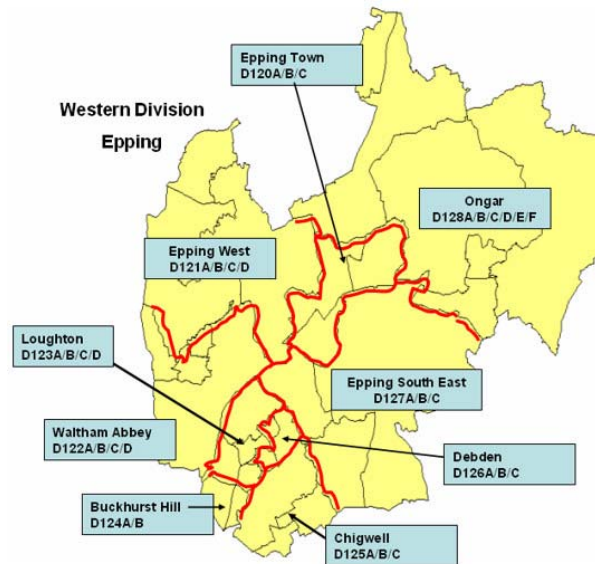
Each neighbourhood will have a named Inspector, sergeant, police officer and police community support officer. These individuals will, working with other partner agencies, listen to community issues and look to provide the long term problem solving solutions for the area in order to lower crime, increase public reassurance and improve the quality of life for residents living within that neighbourhood.

We will aim to make our officers more accessible through meetings, high visibility patrols and a general increase in face to face dealings with the public. This should mean that neighbourhood policing delivers a level of service to the residents, which will lower the fear of crime in areas and place officers and support staff into neighbourhoods where they are most required in order to deal with anti social behaviour and general quality of life issues. This style of policing will make the service more accountable to the public and make the community more of a focus for our policing efforts.

Project Overview

Essex Police are committed to rolling out neighbourhood policing to every Division in Essex during 2006.

Neighbourhood policing is about getting the right people in the right places at the right time, in order to lead the fight against crime, nuisance and disorder, and to make neighbourhoods safer.

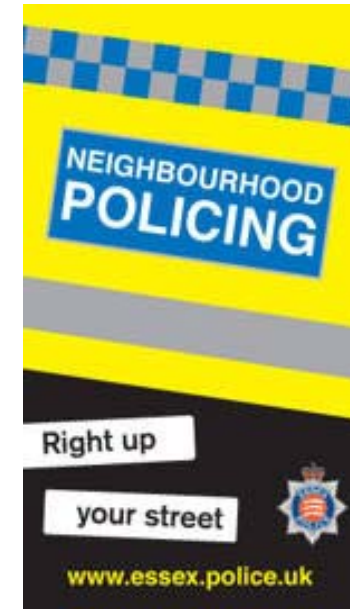
143 neighbourhoods have been identified which consist of 304 wards, each of which will have a dedicated and contactable police officer or team of officers and staff.

Each of the 5 divisions will launch one neighbourhood team prior to 31st March 2006, followed by a full roll out division by division between April and July 2006, well ahead of the government deadline of March 2008.

A neighbourhood team will consist of police officers, PCSOs, CID officers, special constables and community volunteers in differing numbers according to the demands of the neighbourhood. All neighbourhoods will be prioritised and resourced accordingly.
