
The awards were presented by Lord Petre, Patron of the EPFA, and Cllr John Aldridge, chairman of Essex County Council.

Cllr Wixley said, "We are of course delighted with these awards but must pay credit to the work of all those involved in the Traps Hill play area refurbishment project and of course our contractors that look after the grass cutting of the outdoor green spaces - Epping Forest District Council Parks Department and Pinnacle Essex.
