Loughton Town Council looks forward to your company, to pay tribute to those who survived this campaign along with the many that lost their

lives fighting for the freedoms that we enjoy today.

As part of these commemorations the National Federation of Fish Friers are proud to be involved. This was never more important than during the war years when the ingredients were left unrationed to help feed those involved in the war effort and keep the country and their factories working. News round-up

■ SAVE THE DAY - LOUGHTON DAY:

Following the success of our inaugural Loughton Day last year, join us on Saturday, 21 September from 11am - 4pm at Loughton Cricket Club in Traps Hill and discover what Loughton's local groups and organisations have to offer you, while enjoying some great entertainment and beverages.

■ ELECTRIC CHARGING POINT: An

Electric Vehicle charging point has been installed to charge the Loughton Town Council community van. Funding for over 80% of the installation cost was secured from the County Council's Locality Fund by Cllr Chris Pond.

■ GILLINGHAM PATH: Name plates have been installed at either end of the alleyway linking the entrance to Loughton Station with Roding Road. As part of the Town Council's ongoing programme of naming hitherto unnamed alleyways throughout the town, "Gillingham Path" has been named after Donald W. Gillingham (1906-1965), the author of "Unto the Fields", who lived nearby. The Council is grateful to Gareth Leslie, Customer Experience Manager (Design, Heritage & Planning) LU Customer Insight, Strategy & Experience, for facilitating the installation and for his help throughout the whole process.

MEMORIAL GARDEN DAMAGE:

Serious damage resulted following a road traffic accident on 15 March, to a section of the memorial garden in Roding Road. A tree damaged in this collision has been replanted and it is hoped this can be saved. The Town Council will look to restore the garden to its previous condition.



Annual Town Meeting

THE ANNUAL Town Meeting of Loughton Town Council was held on 5 March 2024 at The Murray Hall in Borders Lane. Local community groups, organisations and charities that had been awarded financial assistance by the Council, following their successful grant applications, were invited to attend and showcase their activities to Loughton residents.

This year those applications totalled £35,464.07. Groups awarded were:

Advice - Epping Forest District £8,500. A Certificate of Recognition was bestowed to Mr Paul Mellis of Oakwood Pharmacy for exceptional work, above and beyond, for the benefit of Loughton residents under the Citizenship Scheme. No overall award was made in this year's Loughton Building Design

competition. However Certificates of Merit were given to two Loughton properties that have undergone improvements: 5 Staples Road, for the redesign of the front garden; and to 7 High Beech Road for the sympathetic renovations to this property, both projects considered to improve the street scene of the town.

Loughton Station disability access

AS PART of Transport for London's current project to upgrade the Central line, one element is to improve disabled access across its network. Central line trains are being retrofitted with specific


wheelchair spaces in some cars, requiring stations to have mobile boarding ramps (MBRs) installed near where that car stops on the platform to enable disabled access to and from the train. An

application is currently before the local planning authority for the installation of an MBR on the westbound platform at Loughton Station. The Town Council's Planning Committee did not object to the proposal.

An MBR already installed on the eastbound platform will remain in situ. This new MBR will improve inclusion facilitating access for mobility impaired customers.

Loughton Town Council have requested the installation of a lift at Loughton Station but is currently awaiting a response from Transport for London.





Oakwood Hill community consultation

EPPING FOREST DISTRICT COUNCIL (EFDC) will be holding a community consultation at Oakwood Hill on the morning of Thursday, 20 June. The consultation is part of EFDC's plan to begin a placed based approach

to health inequalities at Oakwood Hill, and the consultation will take the form of a door knocking exercise, asking residents for their views on what EFDC can do as services to help improve the area and your wellbeing.

THE EPPING FOREST YOUTH

COUNCIL has gone from strength to strength as it approaches its sixteenth year. The previous cohort of Youth Councillors promoted the Youth Council in all Epping Forest secondary schools. As a result, a record number of 60 candidates stood for election, which was an outstanding turnout. Elections took place throughout March at seven of the schools, with the highest number of nominations being at Roding Valley High School where 17 candidates were put forward for the vote.

There are currently 24 newly elected Youth Councillors, six

members were re-elected. The remaining 18 Youth Councillors have just begun their induction training and aim to become outstanding Youth Councillors for the next two years.

The 2024 – 2026 Youth Council are made up of thirteen girls, and eleven boys, aged 12-17 years, representing eleven schools and one college. There are three independent Youth Councillors.

The future Youth Councillors have pledged to their voters, that they will give them a voice on current, and local issues affecting young people; that they will make a difference and work hard to achieve their goals.







130 years of good voice

EPPING FOREST-based musical theatre group, Loughton Operatic Society, marks a major milestone in its history entering its 130th year performing for the local community.

To celebrate, the society has pulled out all the stops with an exciting programme of shows for 2024. In May, they staged Bob Fosse's hit musical Sweet Charity. In November, they will perform, family-favourite, The Wizard of Oz at Lopping Hall.



programme that runs during the school summer holiday, encouraging children of all ages to read six library books. All children taking part receive a certificate and medal upon





Annual Report 2024

Planning & Licensing

CIIr Carol Davies

his year (up to the ATM) we held 19 planning meetings, dealing with 198 Planning applications of those we objected to 121 (including Tree objections or TPO'S Tree Preservation Orders), and had no objection to 86. The number of appeals, that's applications, that go to the Secretary of State, was 25.

This year we have also had 6 new Mobile Mast applications. We take these quite seriously, because although we all like to have good mobile reception, some of these have been requests to put new, even larger masts, in some very prominent positions, or right across the street from existing masts! In these cases, we consider if the masts will be detrimental to both the street scene and the character of the road or will negatively impact the residents nearby, who will be most affected.

Another change this year, which needs to be widely publicised is the May announcement that Epping Forest District Council would no longer be consulting with neighbours on licensing applications. Their reason being that as it was no longer a statutory requirement, they didn't have to!

Also, LTC Planning Committee has become very aware of neighbours not even being notified of some planning applications in neighbouring properties which could impact them.

So if you want to avoid any nasty surprises, I would advise everyone to keep an eye on the Town Council's website, where under planning meetings, you can check out the planning agenda before every meeting. It will list all proposals, so you can inform yourself and comment on or object, if you feel strongly about an application.

We note that EFDC made just one new Tree Preservation Order this year, at 78 Algers Road. However, at the same time we're rather concerned to see that there is a readiness for EFDC to order removal of valuable mature trees, and even veteran trees to avoid, even the slightest possibility of future insurance claims against EFDC. The Committee regards tree removal as an

absolute last resort, bearing in mind that mature oaks, for example, may support and provide habitats and sustenance for more than 2000 species of various moths, birds and other insects etc.

In September 2023, the latest government figures showed that the number of planning applications submitted to local planning authorities was the lowest since 2015. Also, the figure for the year to March 2023 was 395,227 which is actually 14% down on the previous year. I think Planning Committee members will find that hard to believe as at certain times of year our agenda is chock full, and our meetings can last the best part of two and half hours with back-to-back applications.

Also of note, is the matter of Enforcement – this is when building works etc have proceeded without planning permission or contrary to the agreed application, or when permission has been refused. I can report 2 appeals for Aura have been dismissed by the Inspector of Planning. This has decreed that enforcement action for the removal of the outside structure and air vents should proceed. EFDC had allowed a further 13 weeks for removal, however, as there has been no action taken by the owners, EFDC are now taking the matter to the Magistrate's Court to enact. The justice system, as we know, has a vast 12–18-month backlog and this is having an impact here.

There have been some large developments in Loughton this year. The Lucton's Field, which was the playing field for Lucton Girls' School, is now edging towards completion. As well as housing, it also includes the Wellness Centre, a gym facility and café. The café is dog friendly, which I have sampled with 'Twinkle' our Bichon Frise, so I can recommend that for any dog owners in the Town. As some of you will know this gym is to replace the community gym that stood behind Loughton Hall and was sold off by the College to build a seniors' care home/apartments. So, we should I guess be thankful for that, even though I think it has taken what is it about 35+ years?

Recreation CIIr David Wixley

The highlight of the year for the Recreation Committee was the building of the new playground on the Roding Valley Recreation Ground, work started on 17 July and was completed for use on 24 August with an official opening on 1 September. This was a happy event with children and teachers from Alderton and White Bridge Primary Schools present in recognition of their contributions during the public consultation phase.

We were also pleased that our playgrounds at Traps Hill, Newmans Lane and Westall Road received Gold awards from the Essex Playing Fields Association and look forward to entering, for the first time, the new playground into next year's EPFA competition.

At the time of writing this report discussions are taking place with Epping Forest District Council regarding the possibility of obtaining funding from the Government's UK Shared Prosperity Fund. A sum of



£30,000 may be available to spend on upgrading playgrounds.

The EPFA also gave Gold awards to the Roding Valley Recreation Ground and the Willingale Road Playing Field. Credit for achieving these awards is due to the work of LTC staff and contractors Pinnacle and Qualis Property Solutions (formerly EFDC Grounds Maintenance).

A survey of trees that the Council is responsible for, was carried out in late 2023. This revealed that a number of trees will have to be removed for safety reasons. However, there are opportunities to plant new trees.

The Willingale Road Nature Reserve continues to benefit from workdays carried out by volunteers and organized by the Epping Forest CountryCare Team. An overnight moth survey took place at the Reserve on the night of the 3/4 July last year. This was a joint survey between EF CountryCare and the Wren Wildlife & Conservation Group. A total of 26 species of moth and one butterfly were recorded. A detailed report can be found in the Recreation Committee's Agenda for its meeting of 6 September via the LTC website.

The annual Jessel Green Family Fun Day was held on 25 June and again proved to be a very popular and well attended event. We were grateful for the support and sponsorship received from local companies and the Cottage Loaf pub. The event also raised funds for the Guide Dogs charity. And as referred to above, a detailed report can be found in the Recreation Committee's agenda of 6 September. Plans for this year's Fun Day, to be held on 23 June, are underway.

Another event to be held in June will commemorate the 80th Anniversary of D-Day on 6 June with the lighting of a beacon on the Hillyfields Open Space at 9.15 in the evening.

The Committee is also responsible for the Council's two community halls, and I'm pleased to report on improvements made to the heating system at Kingsley Hall and the installation of a defibrillator at the Murray Hall. A number of Councillors and LTC staff attended a training session on the use of the defibrillator.

Finally, I thank officers and my fellow Committee members for their help and contributions throughout the year.

Environment & Heritage

Cllr Chris Pond

ork of the EHL Committee this year followed its usual pattern and also dealt with some unexpected issues, the principal of which was the unexpected removal by ECC, without notice, of seven salt bins round the town, these belonged to LTC, having been installed at our cost in the fifteen years up to 2011, when the rules changed. Detailed and lengthy negotiations followed, the matter was even referred to in ECC Full council, but no restitution had been made at the time of writing.

Another matter was the desire of St John's Church to declare their churchyard statutorily closed. This is likely to result in a saving to the church, but a distinct additional cost to LTC. Discussions are ongoing. Walking signage from the Station to the Forest was completed.

The Loughton Wombles litter picking teams have been a great

success. They have met on a generally monthly basis.

The restoration of food markets was much debated. A proposal from Hughmark Ltd to restart a market in spring 2024 was agreed.

Completion of the alleyway naming project, to encourage walking rather than car use for short in-Loughton journeys, was, with one exception, achieved.

The usual business, such as allotment letting and blue plaque installation, was conducted, and a plaque tour conducted in May in conjunction with Essex Libraries.

As well as organising the Christmas lights for both Loughton High Road and The Broadway, we were able to mark the King's Coronation by adding colourful coronation bunting to both areas as



part of the celebrations.

Jointly, with the Planning & Licensing Committee, we identified a lack of regard for Loughton's heritage areas. This was reported to EFDC, but no action resulted.

Many thanks to all the staff who have supported aspects of the Committee's work this year.

Resources & General Services

CIIr Michael Owen

he Resources and General Services Committee bears the responsibility of overseeing the finances of the Town Council and ensuring that it conducts itself with utmost openness, transparency, and ethical standards. The Committee carries out the day-to-day financial transactions necessary for the smooth running of the Town Council and oversees staff salaries, insurance, bill payments, banking arrangements, admin for the whole Council, personnel and employment matters, staff management, IT and office equipment, Members' expenses, management of Buckingham Court, and maintenance of the Kingsley and Murray Halls. Furthermore, the Committee is responsible for producing the quarterly Town Council magazine, "Think Loughton," managing the Town Noticeboards and Website, and administering the Financial Assistance Scheme, Civic Celebrations, such as the Christmas Card Competition and Citizenship Awards, are also organised by the Committee. Furthermore, it conducts policy reviews, contract reviews, training strategy, internal audits, and annual banking and investment reviews. I am pleased to report that the Council received a clean audit report from the External Auditors.

On an annual basis, the Committee reviews the Council's insurances, Council-wide priorities, and policies, such as the Essex Pension Fund Administration Strategy, Investment Strategy and Policy, Members Remuneration Scheme, Procedure to fill a Casual Vacancy, Laptop Policy, Staff Absence Policy, Data Protection Policy, Code of Conduct and Complaints Procedure, Freedom of Information Publication Scheme, Health and Safety, and Training Strategy. This year, the Town Council continued to face significant challenges due to the fallout from global inflation issues, which hinders our ability to plan for the longer term. Despite these challenges, we have tried to keep the increase in council tax to an absolute minimum, whilst making sure we are prudent and can continue to meet our obligations for the long term. We can also confirm there will be no increase in the Councillors' Parish Allowance and many Councillors continue to not take up this allowance. This year the tax base which will be used to calculate the

2024/25 Band D Council Tax for Loughton Town Council as confirmed by Epping Forest District Council (EFDC) is 13,017.5 (12,667.9 in 23/24). This is the figure that when divided into the precept gives the Band D annual amount per household and sets the annual council tax for a Band D property at £76.35, an increase of approximately £4.96 (£0.09 a week). The council has 3 loans totalling £1.4m due to be completely repaid (amortising profile) between January 2026 and July 2027 which will save c£98k pa in loan and interest repayments once repaid. This along with our prudent approach to finances and operations should leave the council finances in excellent shape going forward allowing the council to battle anymore economic uncertainty that may come our way in the short term and to once again hopefully invest for the future of Loughton.

The Committee plays a crucial role in awarding grants to local groups and organisations, ensuring that these awards benefit the residents of Loughton and have a positive impact on the local community. This year, we are supporting 26 organizations (up from 17 last year), and the complete list is available in the February 2024 minutes from the Resources Committee (Totalling o£27k). The grants committee comprises four members as we have now included the previous cycle's Mayor, who brings better insight into the decision-making process due to their involvement in local organisations during their mayoral tenure. Additionally, there is a separate grant provision of £8,500 to Citizen's Advice Epping Forest.

On December 18, 2023, Cllr Murray visited the Office and conducted a financial check on purchase orders and receipts for the Financial Year 2022/23. I also extend my heartfelt gratitude to our Town Clerk, Mark Squire, who continues to do excellent work, our Deputy Town Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer, Kim Lumb, our Community Manager/ Assistant Town Clerk, Pippa Bryce, and all our hard-working officers. Lastly, I thank all the members of the Resources Committee for their commitment and dedication to the welfare of the residents of Loughton by scrutinising the Town's finances carefully and conscientiously.


