New Town Council & Mayor

FOLLOWING THE local council elections in May 2024, a list of all the newly elected town councillors, along with the two new wards created from boundary changes, can be found on page 4.

At the Annual Council meeting on 15 May, and subsequent Extraordinary Council meeting on 29 May 2024, Cllr Katie Valentine was elected as Loughton Town Mayor with Cllr Les House elected as Deputy Town Mayor for 2024/25.

Cllr Valentine grew up in Loughton. After several years of living away, including abroad for a while, she returned to Loughton following her daughter's birth. Katie is married and now has two young children. Her career began in advertising, followed by the Civil Service, she now works in technology for the NHS. Haven House Children's Hospice and Loughton Voluntary Care were chosen as Cllr Valentine's charities for her year.


The new Town Mayor congratulated Councillor

Lopping Hall Restoration

THE VILLAGERS of Loughton

had upheld the tradition of lopping the trees in the forest believing this right had been granted to them by royal charter by Queen Elizabeth I. The lopped wood was used in lieu of coal for domestic fuel.

In 1878 the Epping Forest Act was passed stopping the practice of enclosure and bringing an end to the practice of lopping, although grazing rights continued. In compensation for the loss of lopping rights, Lopping Hall was erected as a community building funded by the City of London Corporation. Opened in 1884 to a design by local architect Edmond Egan it is one of the most important public buildings in Loughton. The terracotta panel which sits above the original entrance to the Hall in Station Road, shows the loppers in action.

The foundation stone, laid in 1883 had deteriorated to such an extent that most of the letter cutting in the stonework was almost impossible to read.

We would like to thank both The Essex Heritage Trust and Loughton Town Council for their assistance with grants which helped us complete this project.

Northern Lights Visit Loughton

LOUGHTON'S KEEN stargazers, and insomniacs, were treated to the wonderous delight of catching a glimpse of the Northern Lights (aurora borealis) over Debden in the early hours of 11 May 2024.

Cllr Carol Davies and her husband, Asier, visited the top of Jessel Green, next to the swing park, in the company of one other female resident on the night of Friday 10 May.

Then after midnight a woman in her dressing gown arrived, accompanied by her two sons with their smart phones, on which they also got some amazing shots of the phenomenon.

All were in awe, sharing their photos and discussing what an extraordinary and unique sight they were witnessing.







LOUGHTON TOWN COUNCIL was honoured to host the lighting of the Beacon at the top of Hillyfields Open Space in commemoration of the 80th Anniversary of the D-Day Landings, and extremely proud to take part in this national tribute which saw over 1,500 beacons lit across the country and overseas.

Cllr Katie Valentine, Loughton Town Mayor, welcomed everyone to the ceremony which included a tribute, read by the 41st Epping Forest Cubs, and prayers were delivered by Reverend Chris Davies representing Churches Together in Loughton. Deputy Lord Lieutenant of Essex, Mr Amrik Sandhu MBA, one of the King's official representatives for the country led the countdown and lighting of the flame.

A big thank you to all who took part and the large crowd of Loughton residents, who attended, supporting this historic, moving, commemorative event.

The beacon was previously lit in this location in 2012 as part of Queen Elizabeth II's Diamond Jubilee celebrations, in 2016 for her 90th Birthday celebrations, and in 2022 for her Platinum Jubilee celebrations.

Community Carers project

BUCKHURST HILL PARISH COUNCIL,

Loughton and Epping Town Councils, and Epping Forest District Council (EFDC) secured funding in June 2024 from Essex County Council to create The Dementia Friendly Community Carers project.

The project to be managed by ÉFDC's Dementia Action Officer and the Chair of the Epping Forest Dementia Friendly Community group, aims to provide support and information to residents caring for loved ones with dementia across the district.

Running until April 2025, with weekly groups being held in various locations throughout the district, the groups will provide carers with valuable information, advice, and time away from their caregiving responsibilities in a safe, friendly and supportive environment.

There are 900,000 people currently living with dementia in the UK which is projected to rise to 1.6 million by 2040.

It is estimated there are 1,578 people living with dementia in the Epping Forest district (NHS Primary Care Stats Aug 2023) supported by a family member, friend or carer.






