OUR 50TH heritage plaque was installed at 19 York Hill, the fourth plaque to be adorned on this particular residence! Current homeowners, Michael and Joanne Burns, are delighted to be living at Loughton's most commemorated address and are investigating whether this sets a World Record.

A dedication ceremony, with a fabulous tea courtesy of Michael and Joanne, was held in August. Cllr Chris Pond, Environment & Heritage Committee Chairman, gave a brief talk on this plaque and the others installed at this site (those for Arthur Bacot and Christopher Cutchey, being installed during Covid restrictions preventing a dedication ceremony).

Our latest plaque commemorates Diana Kennedy, Mexicanist – an authority on everything Mexican, in particular Mexican cuisine. She wrote nine books covering her fifty years travelling to virtually every region of Mexico, interviewing and learning from different types of cooks. Owing to her style of work, she was referred to as a "culinary anthropologist", self-identifying as an "ethno-gastronomer."

Diana Southwood was born on 3 March 1923 at 19 York Hill. Following the outbreak of World War II, in 1941 aged 19, being unable to attend university she joined the Women's Timber Corps, a division of the Land Army. In 1953 she emigrated to Canada. On a last minute trip to Haiti, in 1957, she met Paul Kennedy, a correspondent for The New York Times in Mexico, Central America and the Caribbean. They moved to Mexico, marrying sometime later. Thus began Diana's love of Mexico and its food.

Following her mother's love for nature and her experience with scarcity in wartime England, she developed an interest in the environment, related to food in the sense that when the environment is

destroyed, foods disappear. After settling in Zitácuaro, Michoacán, she built what might be termed an eco-house, establishing a centre of research, teaching sustainable living, keeping animals and growing much of her own food organically. Wastewater was collected from tanks, with a patch of land serving as a filter for it, and much of the energy was solar.

Working on projects focusing on the environment and food she established the Diana Kennedy Foundation gaining tax-free status from the Mexican government. Among numerous awards received for her work, was the Order of the Aztec Eagle from the Mexican government, the highest honour awarded to foreigners in the country. She was also appointed a Member of the Order of the British Empire.

She died, aged 99, in Zitácuaro, Mexico on 24 July 2022.

News round-up

■ WINTER SALT AND GRIT: Loughton Town Council is still awaiting a response from Essex County Council (ECC), Highways Division regarding the salt bins that they removed over a year ago now, without notification. Loughton as we know is not a typical Essex town in terms of geography and has seven steep hills, which are treacherous when we have the inevitable cold snaps and big freezes during the winter months. Whilst we continue to vigorously lobby ECC, we must reiterate that Loughton Town Council is not responsible for pavements/highways. We simply do not have the equipment or staff resources to facilitate gritting for a town the size of Loughton.

We do what we can and as we are delivered a limited amount of salt and grit from ECC each year, we would encourage more volunteers to come forward to help clear snow and spread salt/grit on the pavement and road outside their homes to keep access routes open, particularly in the hillier parts of Loughton. If you would like to help, please contact Debbie Taylor at the Town Council at contact@loughton-tc.gov.uk or 020 8508 4200. Our existing group of volunteers will be contacted directly to arrange collection of their salt/grit supplies for the coming winter.

Nominations are invited from residents, architects, developers, building contractors and owners for their favourite building projects completed last year. Is there a new development, commercial or residential, or a refurbished




Last year's judges awarded two Certificates of Merit:






