We will once again be taking part in the lighting of the Beacons and Lamp Lights of Peace to be held across the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories on Thursday, 8 May 2025 at Hillyfields Open Space, IG10 2PY. We are currently in the planning stage of

this event, at the time of going to print, but are hoping the evening will include: from 8.45pm musical entertainment with tunes from that era, with a rendition of the hymn I Vow to Thee my Country. A national tribute will be read by members of a local youth group.


The above photo (on the right) belongs to one of our Councillors, David Wixley, who has lived for most of his life in Loughton. The photo, taken on VE Day, 8 May 1945, in Cleveleys, Lancs, shows a group of WAAF's, including Cllr

Wixley's mum, posing for the photo (far right). For some unexplained reason in the middle of the group is an older lady, holding a baby, who clearly isn't one of the young WAAF's. This is a 3 generational photo. Perhaps it is symbolic, given that the War in Europe was over, the baby represented a hope for a peaceful future, and that the older lady had probably survived both the First World War and now the Second World War with the WAAF's representing the generation that helped win the latter conflict.

Council tax

THE PRECEPT, the amount collected from residents in 2025/26 to spend on local services and facilities will be £1,061,038. This will set the Loughton proportion of the annual council tax for a band D property as £80.48, an increase of £4.13 (£0.08 weekly) from the current year of £76.35.

It has been another difficult financial year, albeit with gradual lowering of interest rates and more stable energy costs. The Town Council has taken on board the increased National Insurance contributions and worked diligently within a tight budget to maintain service standards for the areas that the Town Council is responsible for. The precept increase has been kept to a minimum, whilst keeping reserves at an adequate and statutory level.

A number of earmarked reserves have been put aside including funding for the proposed handover of the St John the Baptist Church 'Closed Churchyard' to the Town Council (a legal requirement). Also monies to replace the tired flooring at Kingsley Hall, which has not been renewed since the building's inception in the 1970s.

■ SPEED INDICATOR DEVICE: At the Environment & Heritage Committee meeting last November, a highly informative presentation about the concerns over speeding motorists in general, and specifically in the Roding Valley / Valley Hill area, was made by Simon Forsdyke, who organises a local Speed Watch Group. With this in mind, permission has now been granted from Essex County Council, Highways (ECCH) to mount an Evolis, Speed Indicator Device (SID) to lamp post 9, at the junction of Valley Hill and The Meadway. Costs to the Town Council will be modest. Funding for the unit and installation has already been sourced externally, via EFDC Safer Communities, by the local resident concerned. The sign was erected at the end of January.

Despite initial hesitance from some members,




once underway, everyone relished the experience, gaining confidence whilst learning a new skill.
