**WELCOME TO** the Winter edition of our newsletter.

Think Loughton has been produced in the same format since 2008. For this edition, we are trialling glossy paper and invite your comments on whether this has improved the look of the publication. The printing costs remain the same as these are offset by the income from advertisements. We'd love to know what you think.

Local Plan update: At the time of writing we understand that the final report on the district council's Plan is likely to be considered at a special meeting to be held at the Civic Offices in Epping on Thursday 14 December 2017. The agenda for this meeting should provide final details of the sites identified for new housing in the coming years including several new ones submitted by land owners and developers since the public consultation in Autumn 2016.

Our two key objections remain the same - urban intensification and inadequate infrastructure provision. The impact of the loss of our local green spaces on the health and wellbeing of our residents, many of whom are on low incomes with poor life expectancy, is of great concern. The increased demands on our already stretched services that any

new development in the district will make, be these transport and roads, utilities, flooding, schools or health services will be impossible to meet without proper planning and finance.

We are delighted to have received recognition for our work to serve Loughton and its residents particularly from the Essex Association of Local Councils. This Association represents the 300 parish and town councils in the county and provides advice and training for its members. More details of our awards may be found on page 6.

In return, the town council also presents a number of awards itself throughout the year. We invite your nominations for the Citizen of the Year award launched below and the Building Design Award on page 7. We also celebrate the 2017 allotment awards on page 5.

The Memorial Garden in Roding Road, championed by the late councillor, Ken Angold-Stephens has attracted many compliments since its creation in 2014. Sadly, earlier this year the box hedging around the rose beds finally succumbed to disease. We are grateful to several local residents for their generous donations that helped with the cost of replacing the box with a hardy evergreen, Hedge Germander, as recommended by the Royal Horticultural Society.

We are also grateful to the Loughton Rotary Club which has donated 1,000 crocus corns for planting in the Murray Hall garden. These spring flowers are a symbol of the Rotary's 'End Polio Now' campaign.

Finally, on behalf of the councillors and staff, I wish you all a happy Christmas and peaceful New Year.

## Citizenship Awards 2018

Nominations can be in recognition of long service or involvement with a voluntary organisation or local charity, good neighbourliness, organising a campaign to improve community facilities or cohesion, or by an act of bravery or courage.

There are three categories: (A) Acts of courage or bravery in the year in question that have resulted, for instance, in the prevention of a serious crime or the rescue of individuals from danger. (B) Voluntary



Service (i) for people aged 25 or over and (ii) for people under 25 years of age. The Citizenship Awards will be made during the Annual Civic Celebration on Sunday 25 February at 3pm in the Murray Hall.


Winners will be presented with an



## **Council's hat-trick of awards**

**WE ARE** delighted to announce that the town council has received the prestigious award of Essex Council of the Year.

The presentation of the silver salver, framed certificate and £150 cheque for training, was made by the Chairman of Essex County Council, Cllr John Aldridge, at the Essex Association of Local Council's AGM in September 2017.

This award recognised the town council's proactive work for its residents and in particular the provision of

- an increasing number of free or low cost community events and sporting activities
- a generous grant budget so as to help other local organisations and charities to further their vital work in the local community
- a lead in the fight against the proposals in the draft local plan to develop our green spaces; and with our recent move to the
- helping safeguard the future of the library by creating a thriving community hub
- improved access to the Town Council for our residents.

The second award was to our cemetery attendant, Alex Wilson who received the ICCM's Wesley Award. This national award is made to the person who has gone above and beyond in the service of the bereaved. Since Alex joined the council in 2014 he has created a haven of peace and loveliness for our visitors, many of whom have taken the time to comment on the improved ambience which helps lift their mood at times of sadness.

Alex is also passionate about his Scottish heritage and follows the belief of many of his countrymen that the soul would not ascend to heaven without a bagpiper present to play. He is often to be found providing this additional service for mourners at funerals playing his pipes dressed in full regalia.

The third and final awards were presented to the town council by the Essex Playing Fields Association.

The EPFA has been promoting, protecting and maintaining playing fields, playgrounds and sports grounds across the county since 1924. Their annual competition celebrates the hard work of local councils and charities to provide leisure spaces.

This year, the Roding Valley Recreation Ground was named the outright winner of Class 1, playing fields serving a population of 2,500 or more, with the smaller Willingale Road Playing Field receiving a certificate of merit.

In Class 3, Children's Playgrounds, Traps Hill playground was the runner up and both Newmans Lane and Westall Road playgrounds received a Gold Certificate of Merit award.

We thank Paul Hoy, our services manager, and his team and the grounds maintenance staff at Epping Forest District Council for their work which helped win these awards.








## **Council finances**

WE ARE pleased to report that the town council has received a clear audit for the last financial year, 2016/17.

PKF Littlejohn, the external audit firm appointed by the government, has confirmed that "the information submitted by the council in the annual return was in accordance with proper practices and that no other matters had come to their attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislative and regulatory requirements had not been met".

These charts show a summary of the council's financial activity during that year. The figures refer to the income and expenditure during the year, and are allied to the council's committees.

For information, at the end of the year the council's balances stood at £711,875. Of



this. £346,555 represented funds available for general use (down £36,808 on the previous year), with £402,127 earmarked for specific projects. More details of the accounts may be viewed at https://tinyurl. com/yblbwohr

THOUSANDS OF people are contributing to the fly-tipping problem in England, and have no idea they are doing anything wrong. Are you doing the right thing with your waste? Please take the time to find out or you could end up with a criminal record and face an unlimited fine.

Remember - if it's your waste, it's your responsibility. If your waste is found dumped. even if someone else has done it, you could be held responsible for the crime.

Protect yourself by asking a few questions 1. If you use a trader to remove your waste ask to see their waste carriers' registration number issued by the Environment Agency Whether you find someone through social

media, an advert, or even someone approaching you directly - you need to check they are a registered waste carrier. It is illegal for them to

take your waste if they are not and they could be a rogue trader.

Ask for their waste carrier number and vehicle details, and contact the Environment Agency directly on 03708 506 506 for a free instant waste carrier check or check online at www. gov.uk/guidance/access-the-public-registerforenvironmental-information

- 2. Ensure that you receive a transfer notice or receipt before your waste is taken away
- 3. Check where your waste is going Being a registered waste carrier means the person can legally remove your rubbish, but you still need to check what is going to happen to it. Don't be afraid to ask questions and ask for paperwork that shows where your waste is going. A legitimate waste carrier should not object to you asking these questions.

### 4. Protect yourself by taking care with your

- Make a note of who you have given your waste to, their waste carrier details and vehicle details.
- You should never leave any waste such as an old washing machine or scrap metal on your drive or in the street for someone to remove. They may not be a registered waste carrier, and could take the bits they need and dump the rest.
- You should never leave items out for others to re-use. You can donate good quality items to your local reuse organisation or charity shop, or give items to someone who could make use of

These figures show that the Crimestoppers' message is getting through to people who want to make a difference in their local communities. Just one small piece of information that could appear insignificant may be the key to enabling the police to complete their investigations and lead to an arrest and charge being made."

Key Crimestoppers' initiatives in the county over the past 18 months have included a powerful domestic abuse campaign; the introduction of

to me in the Police and Crime Commissioner meeting in February 2017.

My main objective was to deal with the issues surrounding the night time economy and use the legislation available to the police to robustly manage the licensed premises. Within a short period of time two policing incidents occurred and I served a Certificate to the Licensing Committee to ask them to review the closure of both NuBar and Luxe on two separate occasions. I was pleased with the outcomes of both hearings and I hope that that the changes on the High Street since have had a positive impact on residents that were directly affected.

Moving forward you may have seen my

request to residents to help us seek out those individuals that have been using motorcycles and off-road bikes in an anti-social manner. I've been pleased with the responses we have had and this has led to a number of seizures along with prosecutions and fines. This is a national problem and I know there is more to do on this issue. If you know addresses where these bikes are stored or locations they are kept we can manage this information. We will be appearing at a number of the local Farmers Markets with our pop up tent to speak with residents about local issues affecting you. I really want to try and increase the visibility of the team to you whilst managing the daily demand


