Spring into action!




THOSE NEW YEAR resolutions to improve your health and fitness may have slipped a little, but with Spring just around the corner, now's the time to get out and about and be more active!

It could be a walk in Epping Forest or the Roding Valley Nature Reserve with friends and family, a visit to the Loughton Leisure Centre with its exciting new gym facilities and swimming pool or something more organised that has the added bonus of raising funds for our local hospice.

We're helping promote St Clare's 10k run, but if that's too far for you this year, why not take part in the annual town mayor's 4km fun run on Sunday 12 May 2019 on the Roding Valley Recreation Ground. The official start is at 10.30am, with registration open on the day from 9.30am and a pre-run warm up session at 10.15am. The 4km route is suitable for all ages and levels of fitness; you can walk, run or jog at your own pace whilst enjoying the fresh air and beautiful scenery. Category winners will each receive a trophy and all participants will be presented with a medal at the finish. Entry fees are £10 per person with family tickets available. The annual St Clare 10k is taking place at the Hospice on Sunday 7 April 2019, which last year raised an amazing £8,000 for the charity. Council tax

THE TOTAL precept, the amount collected from Loughton's residents in 2019/20 to be spent on local services and facilities, will be £719,000. This means the average household (Band D) will pay just £57.15 for the year or just over £1 a week.

The slight increase on this year's charge results mainly from the loss of the Local Council Tax Support Grant (£13,500). There is also a need to maintain a reasonable level of reserves in order to meet the legal costs associated with the challenge to the Local Plan. This proposes over 1,000 new homes for Loughton and seeks to build on Jessel Green.

The town council has also responded to public concerns regarding the level of policing by allocating £10,000 of new money for community safety. A further £10,000 of new money has also been included to help build up funds to refurbish the children's play area on the Roding Valley Recreation Ground.

EPFA awards



IN OCTOBER 2018, we were delighted to receive a number of awards from the Essex Playing Fields Association for the high standard of maintenance at our open spaces and play areas.

At the presentation in Chelmsford, Cllr David Wixley, chairman of the council's Recreation Committee, received the following awards from Lord Petre, Patron of the EPFA, and Essex County Council Chairman, John Jowers:

■ Overall winner of the Best Kept Playing Field for the Roding Valley

Recreation Ground;

- Gold awards for both the Newmans Lane and Westall Road play areas; and
- Silver award for the Traps Hill play area.

These awards recognise the hard work of the council staff, its contractors and the volunteers who assist with the litter picking.

We particularly thank the Grounds Maintenance Team at Epping Forest District Council for their endeavours that keep the large Roding Valley Recreation Ground looking tidy all year round.

■ AT THE DECEMBER COUNCIL

MEETING, members paid tribute to the life and work of former councillor Monty Juniper who had died in October 2018 aged 97.

After service in WWII, Monty was an active trade unionist and his community service included being a welfare officer for the RBL, an advisor with the CAB and a JP.

In 2016, the citation for his



special Lifetime Service Award from the town council read "few individuals can have had such a distinguished and sustained record of service to our town".

We send sincere condolences to his widow. Dorothy, and his family.

■ OAKWOOD HILL SIGNAGE: The town council has funded new road signage on the Estate to help visitors find their way around. Other recent improvements including the resurfacing of paths, have been jointly funded by Epping Forest District Council and Essex County Council.

memorial bench was installed in the Murray Hall garden to commemorate Ken & Violet Jones. Ken, who passed away in 2007, was Rotary Club President from 1968-9 and served as a Magistrate at Epping. (1922-2004) TRADE UNIONIST

LIVED HERE

Heritage plaque

THE LATEST blue plaque was unveiled in January at 29 The Crescent to celebrate the life and work of Lord Murray of Epping Forest.

Lionel 'Len' Murray was most widely known for his trade union work and his service as General Secretary of the Trades Union Congress from 1973 until his retirement in 1984.

Lord Murray lived in Loughton from 1954 residing at 29 The Crescent from 1967 until his death in 2004.

Born in Shropshire in 1922 Len read English at London University and after a short period as a school teacher, joined the Shropshire Regiment taking part in the Normandy D-Day landings in WWII. After being invalided out of the army Len gained a place at New College, Oxford, where he graduated with a first in philosophy, politics and economics.

He began his career in the TUC in 1947 becoming General Secretary in 1973. In 1966 he was appointed an OBE and made a member of the Privy Council in 1976. In 1985



he was elevated to the peerage as Lord Murray of Epping Forest.

Locally, Len and his wife Heather were members of the Loughton Methodist Church and the Loughton and District Historical Society, and supporters of many charities including the Christian Drama Resource Centre and the Friends of Epping Forest.

The Town Council's Murray Hall in Borders Lane, which opened in 2006, was named in his honour.

This is actually the 42nd plague to be

installed since the heritage plaque project was started in 1997. Some of the more familiar people to be honoured in this way include

- Private Sidney Godley who was awarded the first Victoria Cross of the Great War on 23 August 1914:
- Thomas Willingale who helped save Epping Forest for the people; and
- Ruth Rendell, the crime writer.





MANY CHILDREN were first introduced to the joys of wildlife by a walk to the lake in the Roding Valley Recreation Ground clutching a bag of bread to feed the ducks and other water fowl.

Now, bird welfare experts are warning that a diet high in carbohydrates such as bread is potentially harmful to those birds and could cause a disease called Angel Wing. This is an untreatable condition where the wings become distorted and means the birds cannot fly.

Uneaten bread can also rot in the water causing surface algae to grow and kill the fish and attract rats and vermin.

We are being encouraged to reduce the amount of bread we provide to the birds and supplement this with birdseed, cut grapes or lettuce leaves, peas, corn and oats.
