

WELCOME TO the summer edition of Think Loughton which includes an insert showing the town council's Annual Report for it's work in 2018/19.

Working through the Year End Annual Financial Accounts of the town council for the first time, I am getting a real insight into the depth and diversity of roles undertaken by our councillors and colleagues alike, on behalf of Loughton residents.

A number of functions happen efficiently and unobtrusively. Keeping the **Roding Valley Recreation** Ground clean and litter free is an important role. This area (adjacent to the River Roding) is well known to many local sportsmen and women for football, tennis and athletics and is also a favourite location for a large number of dog walkers. If you have not already been there, it is well worth a visit to an area of natural beauty and variety of wildlife.

The Council takes great pride in the maintenance of the Willingale Road Playing Fields, a number of children's playgrounds, the Church Lane cemetery and smaller areas of land such as Kings Green and Standard Green. The Willingale Road allotments are always popular (only a few plots available currently), so do call the office should you wish to start growing your own produce.

Living in the very heart of Epping Forest, it is not surprising that Loughton Town Council devotes considerable resources into preserving and maintaining the numerous trees within the ward boundaries. Other duties include managing hall hire for both the Murray Hall and Kingsley Hall and the flower baskets and Christmas decorations in the High Street.

The Council is proactive in introducing community events to bring people together in Loughton. By the time you have read this, you may have already participated in the Mayor's Charity Fun Run at the Roding Valley Recreation Ground. The Jessel Green Community Fun Day is now a firmly established event and following the success of the inaugural Loughton Horticultural Show last year, we are continuing the event this year on Saturday 7 September see full article on page 6. There are so many different categories and it is open to everyone with plenty of time to prepare. So don't keep your skills and talents hidden. Enter and give it a go!

On a final note, Loughton Town Council continues to put a significant amount of time, resources and funding into protecting the town's remaining green spaces for the wellbeing of local residents. The Epping Forest Local Plan hearings will now continue well into June 2019. We will advise the outcome of the final deliberations from the Planning Inspector in due course.

Honorary Reeve

CITY OF London Epping Forest and Commons Committee approved Loughton Town Council's nomination unanimously at its winter meeting for Richard Morris, OBE, to receive the title of Honorary

receive the title of Honorary Reeve, representing the Forest Parish of Loughton for exemplary services as a Verderer for the Northern Forest Parishes, including Loughton over the past twenty years.

The office of the Verderer was first introduced almost 1,000 years ago by Saxon and Norman Kings. Verderers administered the Forest Law over the 60 forests used for hunting, protecting the 'vert' (vegetation) and the 'venison' (the hunting animals, principally deer and wild boar) of the forest. Verderers primarily represent local and community interest in the Forest.

Originally in Anglo-Saxon



England the reeve was a senior official with local responsibilities under the Crown, manager of a manor and overseer of the peasants.

On 3 April the presentation of a branding iron was made to Richard Morris, OBE, at Lopping Hall by the Town Mayor, Cllr Murray.

Annual Town Meeting

THIS YEAR'S Annual Town Meeting, held at the Murray Hall in March, welcomed over 50 residents, along with several local groups who were given the opportunity to mount displays, informing the local community about their organisations.

Loughton Town Councillors introduced themselves to the local residents and the chairman of each committee presented their annual report.

Questions from the public were invited and a number of relevant issues were discussed including the EFYC Drugs Project; the disruption caused by the building/maintenance works to the footbridge by Roding Valley High School; and the town council's appeal against the proposed housing development plans for Jessel Green, designated in Epping Forest District Council's Local Plan.

The Town Mayor, Cllr Stephen Murray, announced the Citizenship Award, in recognition of dedicated service to the community, would be presented to Peter Medway at the Council meeting in April, due to Peter's current absence from the country.

A certificate was presented to Alan Wintle by the Town Mayor in acknowledgment of his exceptional voluntary work on the Roding Valley Recreation Ground; along with certificates to representatives from some of the local groups and charities that will receive financial assistance from the Town Council in 2019/20. Grant money awarded totalled in excess of £30,000.

Young Artist of the Year

THE TOWN MAYOR, Councillor Stephen Murray, announced Clara Rodriguez of Roding Valley High School as winner of the Loughton Young Artist of the Year 2019, for her 3D work of a Globe at the Lopping Hall Gallery.

The judges said, "This piece was a worthy winner because it allows the viewer to question the meaning behind the work which you would do when visiting any gallery. It was most creative and a visual response to a very topical theme of poverty and wealth. The face of Donald Trump has been displayed in many art forms and to see his face painted on a globe in such detail; the quality of painting and the actual construction of the object were most impressive".

Diane Rhodes, Founder and Director of the

Gallery said, "We particularly enjoy Loughton's Young Artist of the Year event. All our secondary schools and the college are invited to submit work from their 16-18 year old students for a one week exhibition. We look forward to seeing what our young emerging artists will create – often stimulating discussion and always interesting. Yet again, we have seen a high calibre of art this year and it is always difficult choosing winners because art is very subjective. However, art enriches not only the artist but all of society. This is the fourth successive year the Gallery, run by volunteers, has staged this exhibition".

Clara Rodriguez received a Certificate and Prize from Lopping Hall Gallery and a generous donation of art supplies from Hobbycraft of Loughton.

THE EPPING FOREST Dementia Action Alliance are working together to make Epping Forest a Dementia Friendly Community. The alliance, supported by a group of 16 organisations, many individuals and Epping Forest District Council, have recently piloted a new Business Award Scheme project at Pyrles Lane Shops in Loughton.

Several businesses have joined the alliance working towards becoming a dementia friendly organisation, signing up to meet simple criteria put together by people living with dementia. The measures include looking at signage and lighting and implementing minor adaptations making shopping experiences easier for those living with dementia and their carers.

Part of the pilot project invited secondary schools from across the district to participate in a competition designing a logo to feature on window stickers, for businesses to display, advising the public that they are working towards becoming dementia friendly.

The logo design brief was: to be eye catching, clear to read and

related to local businesses helping to make a dementia friendly community.

An overwhelming number of outstanding creative entries were received from various schools. The winning design from Coral Pask, of King Harold School in Waltham Abbey, is now featured on the stickers being displayed by local businesses who have signed up to the scheme and met the criteria. The funding for the stickers was provided by Loughton Town Council's grant scheme.

THE EPPING Forest Youth Council published its Drugs Project Report which aims to raise awareness about Gateway Drugs. Data was collected from 3,177 pupils from the Epping Forest district secondary schools. Surveys were anonymous to protect the identity of individuals and to encourage participation.

The Home Office has found Nitrous Oxide (N2O) more commonly known as laughing gas, to be the second most popular recreational drug among 16 to 24 year olds in England and Wales. Nitrous oxide is not a controlled drug and has legitimate uses in medicine and dentistry. Under the Intoxicating Substances (Supply) Act 1985, it is illegal to sell to under 18s when the seller believes the substance may be inhaled for the purposes of intoxication.

While it is not illegal for an adult to inhale the gas, many authorities across Britain are concerned about its use.

Nitrous oxide is commonly sold as a food product, notably coffee creamers. The gas aerates the cream and is available on line through numerous sellers, although the sellers have a disclaimer, that products should not be purchased by under 18's, no other checks are made to protect minors from buying them.

Laughing gas canisters can sell for as little as 30p – cheaper than a bar of chocolate.



WE <mark>'R'</mark> SAFE

EFYCS LATEST project WE 'R' SAFE will focus on young people's safety, working with the district's secondary schools to deliver the WE 'R' SAFE personal safety messages in the summer term. Five mini educational films are being produced to promote how to be safe, how to report a crime and how to respond if you are involved in an incident.

The Epping Forest Youth Activities Map has been revised to promote youth groups and activities in the district, and highlight the absence of activities in areas. Young people need activities to become engaged in the community and feel part of a group. Through promoting what's on, and increasing young people's participation, we can assist in reducing the risk of them becoming engaged in gangs and criminal activities. We recognise the relationship between gang crime and drug use and how tackling each problem can help solve the other. Most street gangs are in some way involved in the drug trade, it is crucial that the authorities continue to fund this valuable work particularly in relation to 'County Lines', the drug trade and child exploitation.

CRY (Cardiac Risk in the Young)

IN JULY 2015 the Tudisca family lost their 14 year old daughter Isabelle, a fit and healthy girl, to a sudden and unknown heart condition. As you can imagine this was a complete shock and utterly devastating for them.

The family found help in dealing with their loss through a charity called CRY (Cardiac Risk in the Young), who state that over 12 young people die each week of unknown heart conditions, and 80% of heart conditions suffered by those aged 14-35 years are undetected before death. CRY is trying to get the government to implement a simple ECG in schools for all 14 year olds.

CRY provide great research and support for bereaved families, holding a free heart screening service at St Georges Hospital and offering mobile screening services nationally (see testmyheart.org.uk).

In an effort to raise awareness of what happened to their daughter and the charity's work, the Tudisca family set up their own charity called #forissy and began to raise money through various events with support from the local community. In the last two years, with funds raised, the support of St Antony's school, Woodford Green and the community, they have held five screenings involving 1100 young people. This has resulted in many referrals to doctors and some serious heart conditions being discovered highlighting, even more, the need for this service.

The cost of screening is £50 per person, which is subsidised by CRY who help bereaved families set up and for the free screenings to be made available to the public. #forissy aim to carry out more screenings this year and next, in the hope that the awareness and fundraising continues to be successful.

#forissy contacted Epping Forest District Council and with their help, through the grant aid and public health funding has managed to fund another screening event to raise awareness and help save lives.

The next screenings will be held on 29 and 30 June 2019 at Grange Farm with Colebrook's football club and #forissy.


