AT MAY'S annual council meeting, Cllr Stella Murphy was elected unanimously as Town Mayor for 2019/20. Cllr Chris Pond, in his nomination, referred to 'her long standing residency in Loughton, charitable work and the good qualities she will bring to the role. She is also noted as a renowned home economist, food stylist and authoress, including a book on some rather exotic smoothies'.

Cllr Murphy thanked members for electing her, expressing "her gratitude to former Mayor, Cllr Murray, who would be a hard act to follow, but must be looking forward to a break after attending over 120 events during the past year. Loughton is such a beautiful, dynamic area that I have had the pleasure of living in my whole life and it is very exciting to now be involved with the local community so closely. Charities have always played an important role for me and I am delighted to be supporting: Epping Forest Foodbank, Epping Forest Reuse, Oak View School and Cry (Cardiac Risk in the young). I look forward to meeting with as many charities, schools, community groups and voluntary organisations as possible".

She also congratulated Cllr Tessa Cochrane on her appointment as Deputy Town Mayor. Tessa too has lived in Loughton all her life and is involved in community charitable work. The general consensus amongst members was that the new Town Mayor and her Deputy would form a formidable partnership.

Members paid tribute to the work of outgoing mayor, Cllr Stephen Murray for his exemplary service, commitment and hard work on behalf of the local community.

WE HAVE been working hard to tackle reports of anti-social behaviour and drug activity in Loughton. While carrying out a number of warrants in the area, we have also been focusing on visibility in and around Loughton tube station, patrolling the area at different times of the day, by foot and on bicycles disrupting this type of activity. This is on-going and you can follow our Facebook and twitter pages for updates.

Epping Forest Community Policing Team Officers are spending time over the coming months in schools, educating students on the consequences of carrying a knife, as part of Operation Sceptre, a national operation to tackle knife crime. We will be visiting a number of Loughton primary schools, talking about the dangers involved and where they can find help and advice.

Joining Epping Community Policing Team will be 4 new officers. 2 of whom will be dedicated to Loughton town centre. They will be responsible for tackling violence, protecting victims and providing visibility by increasing local community engagement, working closely with local partners, businesses and retailers and reducing crime and antisocial behavior.



UNIVERSAL CREDIT is a new payment that combines six benefits into one, including Jobseekers Allowance and Working Tax Credits. It is now fully rolled out across the UK. When completely implemented, around 7 million people in England and Wales will be receiving Universal Credit.

A recent survey by the charity found more than a third of people Citizens Advice has helped struggled to provide the evidence needed to complete their claim. Nationally, Citizens Advice has helped over 230,000 people.




