


entertainment and the children's favourite, a ride on Santa's Horse and Carriage (kindly provided by T Cribb & Sons).

JESSEL GREEN is saved! Following the Local Plan Inspector's initial report and subsequently at the District Council Local Plan Meeting in October final confirmation was received. Great news not only for the immediate locality but also for the wider Loughton landscape, community and environment in general.

It has been a long and arduous road to get to this point. I am proud of Loughton Town Council's (LTC) pivotal role in defending this valuable open greenspace for the interests and well-being of local residents. We have incurred some considerable cost; not only in monetary terms but also in time and resources over a number of years now, but the initial recommendations make it all worthwhile. Together with the hugely effective 'Save Jessel Green' campaign and a host of other groups and individuals we have made a real impact. Everyone's commitment to the cause has been both admirable and outstanding. Our concerted efforts have now been fully justified. However, we must not rest on our laurels but ensure this green area is protected permanently for future generations.

Another important Loughton landmark under threat is the purpose built Loughton Library in its current form. Plans are afoot from Essex County Council (ECC) to demolish the existing structure and replace it with a smaller library but with provision of a large number of new apartments. Some twenty-two local community groups currently use the library facilities. The floor area proves much needed quality space for local residents, a valuable commodity, especially when mental health and wellbeing issues are very much in focus. There are also environmental concerns over the potential increase in buildings and vehicles which will inevitably put further pressure on air quality and busy highways. The current library is already a vibrant

community hub and LTC is doing all it can to preserve this status. LTC has successfully submitted an application to register Loughton Library and Town Hall as an 'Asset of Community Value' with the District Council and with the acknowledgement of ECC. The registration means that ECC must give LTC a window of opportunity to be treated as a potential bidder for the asset although ECC is not bound to accept any potential bid. LTC awaits further developments with interest.

LTC's commitment to the community was also shown at the recent Loughton Horticultural Show held at the Murray Hall. Open to any Loughton resident with an interest in gardening, baking and flower arranging. The event proved a great success, with many more entries, building on last year's inaugural show. All donations were raised for the Epping Forest Foodbank. The show ended with the long established Loughton Best Allotments Awards for 2019. Please pencil in Saturday 22 August 2020 for next year's event.

You are very welcome to join us at a number of imminent Christmas events including the moving annual "Light up a Life" ceremony at Kings Green. It would be good to see you too at the 'Countdown to Christmas' festivities at the Broadway, Debden on Friday 6 December 2019 where there will be all the usual free entertainment.

I would like to draw your attention to two initiatives. Do you know someone worthy of recognition for their community work or bravery? Nominations are invited for the 2020 Loughton Citizenship Awards (see page 6). We are looking to celebrate those special individuals in our town who go the extra mile for their fellow citizens. There are categories for both under and over 25 year old. Please don't be shy in recommending someone you know who deserves appreciation.

We are also trying to set up 'Loughton Wombles', (or of similar ilk) in a concerted effort to make Loughton litter free (see page 5). Please come forward and also invite your friends and neighbours if you would like to help.

Finally from all at Loughton Town Council, we wish you a relaxing Christmas break (if that's possible) and enjoy the festivities. All the very best for 2020 and beyond as we enter another new decade.






