Barbara HarmerFirst female supersonic pilot

LOUGHTON TOWN COUNCIL was delighted to commemorate the UK's first female supersonic pilot, Barbara Harmer, with the installation of a Heritage Plaque at 91 Staples Road, Loughton, her place of birth.

Born in 1953, the youngest of four sisters, her family moved to Bogner Regis, West Sussex when she was five. Barbara left school aged 15 to become a hairdresser. Five years later, bored and unchallenged, she achieved a trainee position as an air traffic controller at Gatwick Airport. Meanwhile, with the initial intention of gaining a law degree, she began studying for A-levels, by herself with no tuition. However, the 'flying-bug' had bitten and Barbara saved every spare penny (£5,000) and along with a £10,000 loan paid for her own flying lessons to earn herself a pilot's licence, taking control of an aircraft for the first time in December 1975.

Following a new job as a flying instructor at Goodwood Airport, a determined Barbara spent the next two years studying for her commercial pilot's licence by correspondence course, passing in 1982. Achieving her ambition of becoming a civil aviation pilot proved more difficult than envisioned. After submitting more than 100 applications, she was finally offered a post with a small commuter airline, Genair.

In 1984, she moved onto British Caledonian, and had her first experience of jet airliners, flying the BAC One-Eleven and then the larger McDonnell Douglas DC-10. Four years later Caledonian merged with British Airways. In 1992, from nearly 3,000 pilots – only 40 being women - Barbara was



selected for an intensive six-month conversion course for Concorde, costing $\mathfrak{L}100,000$, fortunately this time paid by her employer! Her ambition now was to become a captain.

On 25 March 1993, Barbara made history flying as first officer on a BA Concorde from London's Heathrow to New York's JFK airport. In 2001, another woman, an Air France pilot, Béatrice Vialle, became the second female to pilot Concorde before the service was finally withdrawn. Only one other woman flew the aircraft, during its development phase, French test pilot, Jacqueline Auriol. After Concorde, Barbara retrained to fly

Boeing 777s, finally taking redundancy in 2009.

Barbara's passions didn't stop at flying, she was also a qualified offshore yacht master with plans to take part in a transatlantic event in 2013. Sadly, in 2009 she was diagnosed with ovarian cancer and died at St Wilfrid's Hospice in Chichester on 20 February 2011, aged 57.

Not long after she began piloting Concorde, during an interview Barbara said "...there's nothing else like it. Even pilots stop and stare, it has an aura about it." Hopefully, people will stop and stare at this plaque in recognition of a remarkably determined and successful woman.




Rudyard Kipling and Stanley Baldwin blue plaque

THE COMMUNITY **POLICING TEAM** at

Loughton Police Station have had the delight of recently welcoming two new Police Community Support Officers. PCSO Adam Dixon-Peters and PCSO Paul Ludewig have been getting to know the Loughton streets by doing

extensive foot patrol up and down the town. They have enjoyed speaking to the residents of Loughton as well as the local businesses on the High Street. This has led to a WhatsApp group being set up for shop owners, so that they can share information about shoplifters and let the other local businesses know to keep an eye out. They of course should still report crimes the usual way, i.e. 999 for an emergency or crime-



in-progress, or 101 for a non-emergency.

Loughton also has a brand new Town Team. During the peak of lockdown, with most local businesses closed and the streets pretty much deserted, PC Luke Maskell and PC Charlotte O'Brien

threw themselves into helping the rest of the Community Policing Team. Most recently a warrant was executed on a seemingly normal residential address in Loughton, where a cannabis factory made up of 571 plants was found. This was dismantled by our very own CPT and Town Team and has led to one suspect in custody and approximately £750,000 worth of cannabis off the streets.

- Sign-posting to other St Clare services that you can access, as well as resources in your local community that could benefit you

If you would like to speak to someone about the loss of someone close, no matter how long ago you were bereaved, the number to call is 01279 967670. The Helpline is free to call, though charges may apply in line with your standard network rate.

St Clare's new Bereavement Support Helpline is funded by £46k of funding from the National Lottery's Community Fund. It is part of a range of new services that the Hospice has launched in response to a community need for bereavement support during the pandemic.

In May 2020, St Clare also developed its popular Bereavement Café project, launching 'online communities' within localised Facebook groups to offer bereaved people an opportunity to continue meeting and connecting with others who understand.



THE CURRENT COPPED HALL was built in 1753 for the Conyers family. The property is situated on a ridge within Epping Forest overlooking its landscaped parkland. Both mansion and gardens are on a site of ancient human habitat. Many important buildings from the medieval, Tudor and Elizabethan ones were demolished prior to the present one being built and enlarged by the Victorians. The estate was last owned by the Wythes family and was subject to a disastrous fire in 1917. It was burnt out with

just a shell remaining. In 1993 the Copped Hall Trust was formed and the house along with 24 acres of gardens was saved for the purposes of education, culture, local community activities and recreation. The restoration programme continues. This wonderful and historic place is run by over 100 volunteers, creating an oasis of good people. 
