News from Loughton Town Council

Loughton Town Council (LTC) and Loughton Cricket Club (LCC) have been working closely together over a considerable time to secure the cricket ground at the foot of Traps Hill, Loughton with 'Fields in Trust' status, providing more robust protection for this valuable green space.

This protection is strengthened through a 'Deed of Dedication' a legal agreement between Fields in Trust and the Town Council, to ensure that the playing field will be retained as a green space in perpetuity. Whilst cricket continues as normal, this status ensures that the land is open and accessible to the local community with a principal use for outdoor sport, play or recreation.

Both LCC and LTC are keen to see more community use of the ground and it is envisaged that a 'Loughton Day' to support local community groups, will be staged on the ground, once the ongoing threat of the Covid pandemic is over.

LCC Chairman, Cliff Greenhill, said "Loughton Cricket Club are delighted to have been granted Fields in Trust status. This now ensures that the ground is safe from building development in the future.

Loughton CC was founded in 1879 and in addition to cricket in a picturesque setting with a thatched pavilion we have always been pleased to support the local community.

The ground hosts a variety of adult and junior matches, spectators are always welcome, and is used by local schools for a variety of sports events

Various community events and festivals are also held on the ground.

We are a Clubmark status community club and money raised is used to keep the playing cost to members as cheap as possible."

LTC Councillor, David Wixley, Chairman of the Recreation Committee said "I'm very pleased that after a thorough and long process the LCC ground has been awarded Fields in Trust status which will protect it against risk of development in the future. I'm extremely grateful to all who have played a part in achieving this.

LCC has a long history in our town and has

made a valuable contribution to the lives of Loughton residents over the years, not just for cricket but for providing a venue for other activities and organizations.

Council tax


THE PRECEPT, the amount collected from residents in 2021/22 to spend on local services and facilities, will be £782,675. This sets the Loughton proportion of the annual council tax for a band D property as £62.44. An increase of £2.97 a year from the current figure, equating to just over £1.14 a week, a weekly increase of 6p.

In keeping with everyone else, the Town Council has not been financially immune from the effects of the ongoing Covid pandemic, which has diminished our income from hall hire and other normal income areas.

The Town Council is highly sensitive to the ongoing crisis and difficulties experienced by the local community so has kept the precept rise to a minimum whilst retaining reasonable reserves.

Restrictions have meant some Town Council projects have been reviewed and re-prioritised. These difficult times have highlighted the value of our playgrounds and a further £26,000 has been allocated to relocate and rebuild a new allpurpose children's play area on the Roding Valley Recreation Ground.

Peter Abrahams blue plaque



IN THESE days of social distancing and lockdowns, one of the avenues the Town Council has been able to continue is its Heritage scheme installing blue plaques to mark notable residents or buildings around the town.

Last autumn a plaque was installed at 37 Jessel Drive in recognition of Peter Abrahams, the South African journalist and 'freedom' writer. He explored, with sensitivity and passion, the injustices of apartheid and the complexities of racial politics. *Mine Boy* (published: 1946), became the first African novel written in English to attract international attention; and his memoir *Tell Freedom* (published: 1954) dealt in part with apartheid.

Peter Abrahams was born in Vrededorp, a suburb of Johannesburg, South Africa, in 1919.

Having early hopes of becoming a writer he faced considerable challenges as a South African. In 1939 he left his homeland. After working first as a sailor, he found his way to London where he became a journalist; living latterly with his wife, Daphne, in Loughton. Here he met several leading black activists and writers including George Padmore: a leading figure in the Pan-African Community; along with Kwame Nkrumah of the Gold Coast, and Jomo Kenyatta of Kenya (both of whom later became Heads of their respective nations).

In 1942, despite a manuscript reader's recommendation, Allen & Unwin published his Dark Testament (made up of pieces he had carried with him from South Africa). More publications followed in both the UK and USA.

In 1956 he moved to Jamaica, where he settled. He was awarded the Musgrave Gold Medal for writing and journalism by the Institute of Jamaica in 1994.

In January 2017, Abrahams was found dead (aged 97) at his home in Jamaica. A forensic examination showed he had been the victim of foul play, with Norman Tomlinson, a 61 year old local man, being charged with his murder.

Essex Playing Fields Association Awards





Trial bus service route 87

THE DEMAND RESPONSIVE TRANSPORT (**DART87**) service replaced the Arriva 87 bus route which was withdrawn on 30 December. Offering a scheduled pick up and/or drop off service requested by passengers in advance, aimed at multiple users going to the same location e.g. a large employer, a rail/tube station etc.

The DaRT87 began running as a 3-month trial from 2 January, in partnership with Epping Forest Community Transport (EFCT), who ran a similar service through the spring lockdown for key workers at Princess Alexandra and St. Margaret's Hospitals. All vehicles are wheelchair accessible.

The route approximately mirrors that of the Arriva 87, covering: Debden, Theydon Bois, Epping, Epping Green, Staple Tye and Harlow. Princess Alexandra and St Margaret's Hospitals are also included, as well as the Epping Forest District Council offices, Epping Forest Shopping Park and New City College – Epping Forest Campus, and tube links at Debden and Epping stations.

EFCT usually requires a £15 12-month membership fee to use their services, however for this trial, that fee has been waived, although registration is required. 
