LOUGHTON TOWN COUNCIL

commemorated its 25th anniversary this year, its inaugural meeting having being held on 8 May 1996.

The Town Council is made up of seven wards, Alderton, Broadway, Fairmead, Forest, Roding, St John's and St Mary's. May 2021 saw the election of 21 Loughton Resident Association councillors and 1 Independent to serve on the newly elected Town Council. Two of its founding members were re-elected in May this year, Cllrs Chris Pond (Loughton St John's ward) and Stephen Murray (Loughton Roding Ward).

The last 25 years fully justifies the campaign in the 1980's for the establishment of a Parish Council here in Loughton, which at the same time also resulted in the formation of the Buckhurst Hill and Chiqwell parish councils.

Loughton Town Council is involved in the provision of so many important small scale community services, including allotments;

Loughton Cemetery; Open Spaces: Roding Valley Recreation Ground including football pitches and tennis courts, Hillyfields and Millennium Remembrance Grove, Willingale Road Playing Field, and the Memorial Rose Garden in Roding Road; commenting on local and strategic plans; the provision of Kingsley Hall and Murray Hall (Community Centres); playgrounds and outdoor gyms, Heritage Plaques, Christmas lights, the War Memorials, small grants to local organisations, community events, local noticeboards, Christmas card and Christmas window competitions; and of course producing this newsletter.

Perhaps one of the proudest and most important achievements was the role we played in fully supporting the community based campaign to save Jessel Green as a public open space, in the heart of one of our town's most built up areas. The Town Council continues its fight to preserve and protect the Forest, a designated UK Special

Area of Conservation (SAC).

The full list of newly elected councillors can be found on page 4. Cllr Rose Brookes was elected as the new Town Mayor and Cllr Barbara Cohen as Deputy Town Mayor at this year's Annual Council meeting, held on 19 May 2021. This was the first in person (socially distanced) meeting of the Town Council following the lifting of Covid restrictions imposed in March 2020. Due to social distancing measures only just having been lifted, at the time of producing this publication, we have yet to assemble the new council for its photograph, hopefully we will be able to do so for the next edition of this newsletter.

'BACK TO NORMALITY' we are now told. At the time of writing. virtually all Covid restrictions have been lifted, but cases continue to rise. I am not sure that any of us know anymore what normality is apart from constantly adapting to new regulations and conditions at regular intervals.

Getting back to some form of normality is welcome though. Our Town Council meetings have now resumed on a 'face to face'

basis, albeit our members have been keeping appropriate social distancing. Current Government legislation has decreed it illegal to hold virtual meetings for Town and Parish Councils, despite the Zoom and TEAM meetings proving such a useful communication medium over the last year or so.

The whole office team is now back for the first time since March 2020. Fingers crossed that separate working shifts. office 'bubbles' and long stints of working from home become a thing of the past.

In the forthcoming edition of 'Think Loughton' we will look to introduce you to the new Town Council and members, elected in May this year, with particular focus on those newly elected faces.

Many of you may have attended the recent Essex County Council's (ECC) online public meeting or seen its exhibitions regarding its plans to demolish the old library and rebuild a new smaller version on the ground floor but with up to 38 apartment blocks above.

The library consultation had attracted much opposition and many questions remain as yet unanswered. The draft plans do not appear to meet the needs of the library users and community groups, with the existing internal floorplan space reduced by some 20%. In keeping with many residents, Loughton Town Council (LTC) is very concerned about the damage to the environment that would be caused by such a large scale development. The projected multi storey, 5 tier building is certainly not in keeping with its surroundings. LTC will continue to oppose through future ECC and EFDC meetings and via Town Council, Planning and Licencing Committee meetings the damage that would inevitably be caused to the Epping Forest Special Area of Conservation (SAC). Town Council members will be closely monitoring further developments.

LTC has been pleased to support the NHS and local residents, by lending its own Murray Hall as a Covid vaccination centre. It has proved a very successful venture for all concerned over the spring and summer months. However as the NHS has completed the initial phases of its vaccination programme, they are now having to consolidate their sites across all areas of Herts and West Essex. The Hall will soon be returned to normal use for regular and casual hirers. Further details can be found on our website.

We are proud to celebrate the 25th anniversary of LTC, since its inaugural meeting in May 1996. The Town Council is the first tier of local government and with twenty-two Town Councillors spread over the width and breadth of Loughton we have the most local knowledge. We know what is important to Loughton's residents and will continue to protect local interests, hopefully for the next 25 years and beyond.

Loughton library redevelopment



following issues were raised:

The Library consultation had attracted much opposition with many questions remaining unanswered:

■ The plans do not meet the needs of the library users and community

A PUBLIC consultation on plans for the redevelopment of Loughton Library began in July with residents invited to share their views on the proposals by 1 August 2021.

The project, led by Essex Housing, is to demolish the current library and town hall on Traps Hill owned by Essex County Council, to be replaced by up to 38 residential apartments on the upper levels, with provision for a library and space for community partners, meeting rooms, events and a new outdoor learning and activity space on the ground floor level.

Loughton Town Council discussed this proposal at its meeting on 13 July, whereby the groups.

Existing floorplan space reduced by 20%.

■ Damage to the environment caused by the large scale of the development.

Multi storey 5 tier building not in keeping with surroundings.

■ Information lacking on the temporary rehousing of current library occupants, including Town Council staff.

Councillors agreed to oppose the current plans, in particular, the damage that would inevitably be caused to the Special Area of Conservation (SAC) by this proposal. We await further developments.

MURRAY **HALL:** Following its very successful Phase 1 and Phase 2 vaccination programme. the NHS left the Murray Hall in Borders Lane, on 26 July 2021. The NHS will now be consolidating

sites across all areas of Herts and West Essex as they no longer require the same level of services. Loughton Town Council was extremely proud to be able to play its part in the national vaccination programme, helping the country to overcome this awful pandemic. We are now undertaking measures to ensure the hall is ready for use by its regular and casual hirers, and we look forward to making the Murray Hall available to the community once again for various purposes.

■ REMEMBRANCE DAY PARADE: The commemorations on Sunday 14 November 2021 will start at 11am with two minutes silence at the War Memorial on Kings Green. This will be followed at 11.50am by the Annual Parade from Loughton's Royal British Legion Headquarters in Church Hill to the War Memorial. At 12.15pm the Remembrance Service and Poppy Wreath ceremony will commence followed by the march off up Church Hill.

has joined Chigwell Parish Council as Deputy Town Clerk and we wish him every success in his new role.


Latest heritage plaque

ON 2 JULY this year, Loughton Town Council was delighted to honour Sir Leonard Erskine Hill FRS and his son Sir Austin Bradford Hill FRS, by installing its latest heritage plaque on the entrance gate pier to Nafferton Rise, the site of Osborne House/Nafferton Lodge, one time residence of these two eminent medical professionals.

Sir Leonard was born on 2 June 1866, in Bruce Castle, Tottenham, (where his father, George Birkbeck Hill, a famous scholar and commentator on the works of Samuel Johnson was Headmaster). Leonard had wanted to become a farmer, but coming from a distinguished family, his parents 'decided' he should enter the medical profession, and he became a physiologist.

His work on blood pressure led him to believe "arterial pressure could be taken in man as rapidly, simply, and accurately as temperature could be taken with the clinical thermometer". This work developed into the Hill's sign. He later performed research into decompression sickness, oxygen toxicity, and the effects of carbon dioxide in diving; supporting linear or uniform decompression profiles. This type of decompression is used today by saturation divers.

Sir Leonard was also a distinguished watercolourist and wrote children's stories. Being fond of the outdoor life, he went every



day to bathe in a pond in Epping Forest. He was knighted in 1930 and died in his 86th year on 30


One of Sir Leonard's sons, Austin Bradford Hill (known as Tony), was born in London on 8 July 1897. As a child he lived at the family home, Osborne House, Loughton and was educated at Chiqwell School.

From childhood, Austin had wanted to be a doctor. Following the outbreak of the first world war in 1916 he volunteered for training as a pilot in the Royal Navy Air Service, and was posted to the Greek islands to support the attack on the Dardanelles. In November 1917 he developed pulmonary tuberculosis and was sent home 'to die'. Two years in hospital and two years of convalescence put a medical qualification out of the question, instead he took a degree in economics by correspondence at London University.

Advised and encouraged by Major Greenwood, he developed a career in medical statistics, first at the Medical Research Council and subsequently at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine.

As an epidemiologist and statistician, he pioneered the randomised clinical trial and. together with Richard Doll, demonstrated the connection between cigarette smoking and lung cancer. Hill is widely known for pioneering the "Bradford Hill" criteria for determining a causal association. He was knighted in 1961.

On his death in 1991, it was written "to anyone involved in medical statistics, epidemiology or public health, Austin Bradford Hill was quite simply the world's leading medical statistician."

THE DISTRICT Council's Dementia Friendly Communities programme focuses on improving inclusion and quality of life for people with dementia in several ways. Encouraging communities to work towards becoming dementia-friendly and supporting those living with dementia to continue to live in the way they want.

Epping Forest Dementia Action Alliance (EFDAA), launched in May 2016, brings together individuals and organisations committed to improving the health and social care outcomes for those affected by dementia. EFDAA continued to grow throughout the pandemic, at a time when those affected by dementia needed care and support more than ever.

A successful funding bid by Epping Forest District Council's Community, Culture and Wellbeing service helped create a 10-week pilot programme with dementia-friendly activities.

The Building Dementia Friendly Communities project includes Walking in Nature, Dance Connect and Falls Prevention sessions which start in September. Active Essex is helping fund the sessions at a subsidised rate for people living with dementia and their carers.

The team won vouchers from London Met and a free digital mentoring session by NatWest to explore their business concept even further.




