# Loughton's / Buckhurst Hill's unknown mansion

**THE LOUGHTON** & District Historical Society has just published its 47th book.

Maggie Pollitt Brown and Lynn Haseldine Jones have researched the history of Holmehurst, in Manor Rd, a large property in its own miniature park.


The house is little known, being set in its own secluded private grounds, and not easily seen by the public. It is over 150 years old, and was designed by the Loughton architect, Edmond Egan.


Brown and Jones go through the very varied occupiers of this remarkable house, who range from a manufacturer of surgical hemp, and an Australian paper merchant, to a Swedish match magnate, who must have bought it to demolish and redevelop, which attempt it happily survived, because in 1939 it became home to anti-Hitler Sudetenlander refugees who were exiled when

Germany annexed Czechoslovakia after Chamberlain's infamous "piece of paper". and then after the War, for resettlement of the "Loughton Boys", Jewish survivors from the notorious Theresienstadt ahetto/ concentration camp. The first-hand accounts of some of these people, now advanced in years, is most moving.

The illustrated 176-page book, again expertly designed by Ted Martin, which is published in connection with the Epping Forest District Museum, and their current Loughton Boys exhibition, is available direct from the LDHS (call 020 8508 2361), at the Waltham Abbey Museum, and the Loughton Bookshop, price £7.50.

Why "Loughton / Buckhurst Hill"? Because in 1995 the parish boundary was changed, and Holmehurst, in Loughton for a thousand years, then found itself in Buckhurst Hill...

Message in a bottle

Do you live alone? Could the emergency services access vital details about your medical history or next of kin?

Message in a Bottle is a voluntary scheme operated by Essex Neighbourhood Watch and is intended for use by any person who is living at home alone.

The scheme provides the Emergency Services with vital details of any illness or allergy you may suffer from, medication you may be taking and the name of a person to be contacted in the event of you suffering a sudden illness or personal accident.

## How does the scheme work?

Your details are stored in a plastic container which is kept in your fridge (as this is the last item to suffer damage in a fire). Two special stickers known to the emergency services and other caring agencies, are put in your house - one on the outside of your fridge and the other on a wall or panel inside your front door.

# **Loughton Building Design Award**

Last year the judges presented awards to two properties: 2 Connaught Avenue, IG10 4FB (below top) – the conversion of a house into flats, upon which the judges noted "The conversion has enabled it to maintain its looks as a house rather than the block of flats that are housed within."; and Royal Oak Close, IG10 4FD (below bottom) – the conversion of a much-loved Public House into flats with a number of houses to the rear, the judges commenting "The developer has maintained the heritage frontage aspect on Forest Road whilst also providing much needed housing to the side and rear facing onto Smarts Lane".







## **Professor of** Adventure honoured

AT THE end of July, the latest (48th) heritage plaque, celebrating Loughton's history, was installed at Walnut Cottage, Stony Path. IG10 1SJ, to remember Millican Dalton -Environmentalist and "Professor of Adventure".

Millican Dalton was born on 20 April 1867, to a Quaker family in Nenthead, Alston, Cumberland. At age 7 his family relocated to Essex, where he enjoyed being out in the wild, experiencing adventures. As a young man he worked in the City as an insurance clerk, and lived at Walnut Cottage, although apparently spent much of his time sleeping under canvas in the garden.

Aged 36, Millican found the lure of the wild - or the tedium of the office - too much and decided to leave Loughton and head off to Borrowdale in the Lake District in pursuit of his life of adventure. It was here that he enjoyed his simpler life of self-sufficiency, living in a cave during the warmer months, located on the

eastern flank of Castle Crag, known locally now as "Millican Dalton's Cave", (but retreating to a wooden hut in Buckinghamshire during the

Somewhat ahead of his time, he was a vegetarian, pacifist and teetotaller, who offered his services as a climbing guide to earn a small income to live off and adopted the self-styled moniker "Professor of Adventure". He lived in his cave for almost fifty years, carving into it his epitaph, which reads 'Don't waste words, jump to conclusions.

In the winter of 1946-47 Dalton's hut, in Bucks, burnt down whereby he resorted to living in a tent. Sadly this proved too much for a man of his age and frailty, and he contracted pneumonia from which he died in Amersham Hospital on 5 February 1947, aged 79.

Loughton Town Council extends its thanks to the residents of Walnut Cottage for nominating this plaque and allowing its installation.



## Hospice Trustee calls on local people to leave a legacy

**ST CLARE** Hospice Trustee, Mark Astarita, is making an impassioned plea for local people, in West Essex and East Hertfordshire, to consider making a gift in their Will to St Clare Hospice, in order to help the charity continue to provide outstanding care to people in the local community.

The audience was treated to refreshments and given a goody bag as well as being entertained by Performing Arts student Elise who sang a mesmerising rendition of Celine




Dion's track My Heart Will Go On.


