## **Council tax**

THE PRECEPT. the amount we collect from our residents in 2022/23 to be spent on local services and facilities, will be £829.663. This will set the Loughton proportion of the annual council tax for a band D property as £65.16, an increase of £2.72 a year from the current figure of £62.44. This equates to just over £1.25 a week, (a weekly increase of 11p).

Loughton Town Council (LTC) has not been financially immune from the continuing effects of the ongoing Covid pandemic, which has reduced our income from hall hire and affected other areas of operations.

LTC continues to be highly sensitive to the ongoing crisis and the difficulties experienced by the local community and has kept the precept rise to a minimum, whilst retaining a reasonable level of reserves.

This has meant that some Town Council aspirations and projects have been re-prioritised. However, the principal projects remain on course and a further £12,000 has been allocated to relocate, move, and rebuild a new all-purpose children's play area on the Roding Valley Recreation Ground.

Loughton Town Council was delighted to receive several awards, including a gold certificate in Class 1 (Playing fields serving communities of more than 2,500 residents) for Roding Valley Recreation Ground (RVRG), and in Class 3 (Children's playgrounds), alongside a merit certificate for Westall Road playground. Most notably, Traps Hill playground was voted outright winner of this category, judged to be the best playground out of 120 competition entrants.



Our gratitude is also extended to all volunteers that carry out litter picking at the RVRG daily, in all weathers, and a special thank you to the Town Council's Park Warden Team who visit all the playground and recreation sites daily, ensuring they are clean, tidy, and safe for use. All those mentioned play a vital role in the Town Council's work, it is a true collective effort.

Finally, we would like to recognise the fine work undertaken by the EPFA. Formed in 1924, it provides help and advice to parish and town councils alongside independent sports clubs, striving to protect playing fields and sports facilities, particularly against the threat of development. Also encouraging facilities are maintained to high standards and promoting their upgrading, in particular, to reflect inclusivity. As the Association nears its centenary year, it is hoped that Essex parish and town councils and independent sports clubs who are not yet members, will join to further strengthen the Association going forward.





## Hedges - a vital resource



**IN LOUGHTON,** bordering the forest and outskirts of London as we do, our hedgerows provide habitats key to supporting plants and animals, providing food and shelter, creating vital green links to help wildlife move freely and keep populations healthy. Creating new hedges or properly maintaining old ones is vital.

Loughton's hedges are under threat, either growing out, not being properly maintained, dying, or being removed altogether. This is mainly due to the large amount of building development, changes in fashion and a lack of knowledge.

We can improve the situation though by learning how to maintain our hedges properly. Trimming on a 2-3 year rotation provides two and half times more blossom for pollinators. Trimming in an A shape, narrower at the top and thicker at the base, offers wildlife maximum protection, while still allowing light to reach the ground flora.

Situated on the edge of the forest, hedge boundaries were traditional in Loughton. Across the town we have some ancient hedges too. The main one you might know borders Jessel Green. Not only is it strong but it helps nature and is attractive on the street scene. With climate change a key factor a natural native planted hedge is the perfect solution. Along with rainforests, our humble hedgerows store millions of tonnes of carbon.

If you are moving house or making homeimprovements you might like to think before removing a hedge, garden, grass, flowers, and trees and replacing with a manmade border, along with installing low gates or high coping stones. They keep out hedgehogs and stop them getting to food or shelter. If you do have a hedge or are thinking of planting one, make sure you include a diverse range of native species that support the most wildlife. Boosting our network of hedgerows would create more than 25,000 new jobs over the next three decades.

The recent COP26 international climate summit showed, the window for action on the climate emergency continues to shrink. We know that one of the readymade solutions to the climate and nature crisis sits just outside our front door and that's – the humble hedgerow. Loughton Cricket Club




