
Chris Neilan, the district council's tree expert explains. "We all want a good place to live. We need our environment to be

one where we, and the people we care about, can be safe, happy and healthy. An attractive environment helps us to live richer lives in a whole variety of ways. A big part of that is having trees and not just anywhere and anyhow, but the right trees in the right places.

Sometimes these trees are just functional - say helping screen off an unattractive view or providing shelter for birds, or other wildlife. Trees can also be special in their own right. This may be because of their great age - Loughton has many trees dating from 1760 or even earlier, which could reasonably be described as living monuments. Other trees are special to us in more personal ways because of their size, how they mark a particular location or frame a view, because of their links to special people or events or, not least, purely for their great beauty."

0% Precept increase

WE ARE pleased to announce there will be no increase in the local precept such that the amount of council tax specifically for Loughton this coming year for a Band D property will remain at £49.18. This amounts to less than 95p a week for Band D householders, which continues to provide excellent value for money given the range of services which the town council delivers locally.

Cllr Stephen Pewsey, chairman of the Resources and General Services Committee said, "The town council has not increased its precept for five successive years, and I'm delighted that we'll be able to keep the precept unchanged again in 2015-16. By focusing resources on our public-facing activities and through careful management of reserves, our many responsibilities still come at a bargain price without losing any of the quality of service Loughton residents have come to expect."

Missing war memorial names

THE LOUGHTON War

Memorial on Kings Green provides an important focus for commemorating those local residents who paid the ultimate sacrifice for this country during the First and Second World

In 2002, new plaques were erected in honour of the fallen of



the Second World War, whose names had never been put on the war memorial, and also to add some missing names from the First World War. The town council has now received several new requests for the names of family members not originally included in the plaques to be added. The new names currently under consideration are Warrant Officer Harold James Bassingthwaite (d 1945), Pilot Officer Gerald Frank Russell Cooke (d 1942) and 2nd Lieutenant Harold Johnson Martin (d 1942).

We are currently researching this and invite you to visit our website and check the lists of names included on the current Role of Honour for Loughton.



THIS POPULAR annual event will be back again this May with something for all ages.

The festival begins on 2 May with an organ recital played by some of London's top recitalists from the City of London and Eastern Society of Organists, an organisation for those passionate about the organ and its music. It closes with a football tournament on 30 May.

His Excellency Kamalesh Sharma, Secretary-General of the Commonwealth said:

"Fly a Flag for the Commonwealth is a most imaginative way for people in local communities - wherever they live, learn or work - to join together with others throughout the Commonwealth in a spirit of respect and understanding to celebrate the variety of unmatched diversity of our global family. LOUGHTON'S East 15 Acting School based at Hatfields, off Rectory Lane, was founded in 1961 by Margaret Walker (1922 - 2013). It grew from the work of Joan Littlewood's famed Theatre Workshop, based at the Theatre Royal, Stratford, with its postal district of E15.

Tales of East 15 and its alumni successes over the last 50 years are legendary. The school now offers some eleven undergraduate and postgraduate programmes under the guidance of the director Leon Rubin, and has taken its place on the global stage, boasting students and staff from some 25 countries.

Joan Littlewood, (1914-2002), is having the centenary of her birth celebrated across the country this year with special performances of her work, and a 1st class postage stamp being just some of the many ways in which she and her legacy are being remembered.

Margaret Walker was the member of Theatre Workshop that Joan tasked with establishing an acting school to promote the study of the, then, revolutionary techniques employed by the company. Margaret was not only key to establishing East 15 but, for almost the entire



time she ran the school, also lived there.

Theatre Workshop broke new ground, re-interpreting the classics for a modern age, commissioning new plays from socially committed writers, and creating an ensemble capable of inventing new work, such as the now legendary Oh! What a Lovely War.

The blue plaque was unveiled in January by town mayor, Sharon Weston, together with Philip Hedley CBE, Joan Littlewood's






