

News from Loughton Town Council

Celebrate the season

FOLLOWING last year's successful pilot, the town council has invested in a 3-year Christmas lighting scheme using reusable trees on the lamp columns in The Broadway and the High Road, each with 200 LED bulbs powered from the mains. The display will also extend into Old Station Road and, new this year, thanks to a donation from Higgins Construction, the large horse chestnut tree outside Forest Hall will be lit with 3,000 bulbs.

We also hope local businesses and shops will lend their support to help brighten the shopping centres by decorating their windows. Judging of the displays will take place during the first week in December with silver cups and £100 charity cheques awarded to the winners of each shop category (charity, independent and national chains).

Here are details of some of the festive events in the town this year:

* Thursday 26 November – this year the festivities will start with a short carol concert in St Mary's Church at 4pm attended by the town mayor, and then a celebration of the lights with mince pies and mulled wine outside the church. * Friday 27 November - the celebrations move to The Broadway starting at 4pm with live music and a visit from Santa who will help the town mayor, Judy Jennings, switch on the lights. The decorations here include a specially lit festive message above the arcade at Brickclamps Path. After completing his duties in The Broadway, we hope Santa will take a carriage ride around the estate stopping at the Cottage Loaf pub for more live music.

Saturday 28 November – the poignant annual Light up a Life event, organised by the

town council in partnership with St Clare Hospice, will be held on Kings Green. Gather in the foyer of the Loughton Methodist Church, 260 High Road from 4.30pm for the procession to Kings Green and the lighting of the tree lights at 4.45pm. I am pleased to confirm that once again the town council has received a clear audit for its 2014-15 annual accounts and governance statement. These may be viewed on the website at www. loughton-tc.gov.uk/7ac1415a. pdf or on request to the council offices.

Are you familiar with the drinking fountain on the corner of Loughton High Road and Station Road? It has been a prominent landmark in the town since the 1870s, although the original brick structure was replaced with the wooden canopy after it was knocked down by a bus in 1934. Repairs have been carried out to the canopy as one of the oak corner posts had rotted badly at the base probably owing to the salt and water spray splashed up from the pavement and the road. We will soon be switching the water supply off for the winter but it will be turned on come the spring to provide free and clean

refreshment.

A big thank you to all who took part in the consultation during the October half term holiday to help us choose new equipment for the Traps Hill play area. The next stage will be a formal tender process and the final designs will be on display early next year with the work scheduled for April 2016.

Anti-social behaviour takes many forms but a new problem has arisen with unauthorised metal detecting on the Willingale Road Playing Field. Anyone wishing to use a metal detector must always seek the written permission of the land owner before undertaking this activity. The town council is unlikely to give permission for this practice on its land for safety reasons.

Finally on behalf of the town councillors and staff I send season's greetings and wish you all a peaceful new year.


B) Voluntary Service

Allotment awards ceremony

TO HELP celebrate the wonderful amenity of 3 allotment sites in the town, the town council holds an annual 'Best Allotment' competition.

This year's professional judge was Karen Kenny, president of the National Society of Allotment & Leisure Gardeners. Karen had previously judged the inaugural competition in 2009 and was very pleased to see how the sites had improved. She praised everyone for their efforts and was impressed with the many new plot-holders who had shown much enthusiasm in creating good plots within such a short time.

At the awards ceremony, held in September at the Willingale Road site, town mayor Judy Jennings congratulated all the allotment tenants on their hard work in cultivating their plots.

The winner of the 2015 Best Allotment in Loughton was Rosie Partridge from the Loughton Potato Ground. Rosie, a previous winner in 2009 and 2014, received the large silver cup and a £25 gardening voucher. Karen commented that "Rosie's plot was delightful, well planned and bursting with good quality produce that attracted pollinators and other insect life; an altogether excellent example of allotment growing".

The runner up was Teresa Witham, from the Willingale Road site, who was presented with a silver salver and certificate. The judge's comment was "an attractive fun plot with many ingenious plant holders".

Winner of the Best Newcomer Award for



those with less than two years' experience was Carol Wilkins from the Roding Road site. Carol who had held her plot only since July 2014 received the commemorate shield and a certificate. The judge's comment was "a really excellent first year with a good variety of produce and use of companion planting". The town mayor also presented certificates

THE UNIVERSITY OF THE THIRD AGE

THE WOMEN'S INSTITUTE (WI) was originally formed in 1915 to revitalise rural communities and encourage women to become more involved in producing food during the First World War. Since then the organisation's aims have broadened and the WI is now the largest voluntary women's organisation in the UK.

As one of the oldest surviving WI's our Loughton Branch will be celebrating its own centenary next year in 2016. Their meetings are held at 2.15pm at the Royal British Legion Hall, 118 Church Hill, on the first Wednesday of every month except January when it is on the second Wednesday. Members enjoy a broad selection of speakers and entertainers each month, as well as a wide range of activities such as a Christmas party, musical afternoons, lunches, coffee mornings and a strawberry tea. They also arrange several trips out to craft fairs, gardens, music halls and other places of interest.

Barbara Cook, the branch secretary writes, "Although we are now a rather small institute we are still reasonably active and very sociable. We celebrated the WI's centenary this year in June with tea and a special cake cut by two of our members; these two ladies, both in their early 90s, joined the Loughton WI in the early 1980s and we are proud to say are our longest serving members. Although, by comparison with other institutes, ours was a very low-key celebration, it was thoroughly enjoyed by all. We look forward now to our own centenary celebrations.

Many of you will have followed the Great British Menu series on BBC2 which celebrated the work of the WI through food. So we are delighted to have received permission to reproduce one of its classic recipes here for you to try.



After Christmas Cakes

(Ideal for using up leftover chocolate and nuts after Christmas)

225g self-raising flour A pinch of salt 100g margarine 75g granulated sugar 50g plain or milk chocolate, fairly finely chopped 25g Brazil nuts, chopped 1 egg 1 tbsp milk 1/2 tsp vanilla flavouring

Method

1. Heat the oven to 200C/gas mark 6. 2. Lightly grease a baking tray. Sieve the flour and salt; rub in the margarine until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar, chocolate and Brazil nuts. Beat the egg lightly; combine with almost all the milk and add the vanilla flavouring. Mix thoroughly with the dry ingredients to form a very stiff mixture which will just bind together. Add the extra milk if necessary.

3. Shape into 10-12 rough mounds on the prepared baking tray. Bake for about 12-15 minutes or until firm to the touch. Place on a cooling rack.

Town art competition

LOUGHTON ARTS CENTRE, located in the High Road next to Lopping Hall, is planning a special exhibition of young local artists work from 8 January till 5 February next year. They are inviting Roding Valley, Debden Park, Davenant and Oakwood schools to submit the work of their students to be hung for one week for each school.

Each week judges will nominate a first and second prize for what they consider the best pictures. The town mayor will be presenting these prizes, along with a certificate, at a special event to take place at 7.30pm in the evening of 4 February 2016.

The Arts Centre, opened in 2011, aims to increase the profile of the visual arts in Loughton by providing a permanent exhibition space and an information centre for the arts within the area.

All exhibitions are free and change once a fortnight. The centre, which is open from Monday to Saturday 10am to 4pm, is staffed by friendly and helpful volunteers. They will be happy to discuss any aspect of the exhibition with you and deal with any other queries you may have.



New honey bee apiary



IN AUGUST, town mayor Judy Jennings was delighted to officially open the new apiary at the Roding Road Allotments. This large site, owned by the town council, is managed by the Roding Road Allotments and Leisure Gardens Association (RRALGA).

Dave Mallindine, a member of the Epping Forest Beekeepers Association, had been given permission by the RRALGA to take over an overgrown wooded area of the site for the apiary. Following extensive clearance work and tree pruning, it is now a small fenced nature reserve providing a habitat for local wildlife and an ideal location for the new hives.

At the official opening, Dave gave an informative talk on the life of the bees and the hives, and how they are managed from the introduction of a new swarm through to the harvesting of the honey. Dave has also studied microscopy to learn

Cllr Jennings with Dave Mallindine learning about the hives and honey production more about bee anatomy. He is now able to identify the source of the nectar from which their honey is derived and certain bee diseases and parasites which can threaten their survival.

Those present at the opening were able to taste some of the first collections of honey from the hives and declared it delicious.

Cllr Jennings described her visit to the new apiary as fascinating and great fun as she had to dress up in the protective suit. She also congratulated the RRALGA committee on their work and said how pleasing it was to see so many of the allotment plots in full production.

Also present for the opening were representatives from the town council and RRALGA together with Eric Beaumont, chairman of the Epping Forest Beekeepers Association and its secretary Robin Harman.



Have you heard about Universal Credit?

UNIVERSAL CREDIT

(UC) is the new benefit being phased in by the government's Department for Work and Pensions. It citizens advice bureau

will eventually replace the following benefits and tax credits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support
- Allowance
- Child Tax Credit
- Working Tax Credit
- Housing BenefitBudgeting loans.

UC is coming to Loughton Jobcentre in February 2016. From then, if you are single (no children), rent your home and become unemployed and wish to claim benefit, you will apply for Universal Credit (instead of applying for Jobseeker's Allowance).

Who can get Universal Credit?

UC is a benefit for people of working age. This means you must be under the age when you can make a claim for Pension Credit. You'll have to meet various conditions to get UC. These include accepting a claimant commitment, a document that says what you'll have to do to prepare for work, find work, get better paid work, or work more hours. For example, you may have to go to interviews to help yourself find work or apply for jobs.

How do you claim it?

If you are required to make a claim for UC after February 2016, then the first stage is to make an online claim at: www.gov.uk/ universalcredit

The second stage is to go to a face-to-face interview at a Jobcentre Plus office.

If you don't have internet access or can't use the internet, you should be able to use computers at your local Jobcentre Plus office. Staff there should be able to help if you get stuck while making your claim or you can get help from the Universal Credit helpline.

Your local library also offers free computer use. In exceptional circumstances, you may be able to claim by phone or with a home visit.

It won't be possible to fill out a paper form. If you are able to claim by phone or with a home visit, an adviser will complete the online form for you.

From presents to swag

With the Christmas holiday season almost upon us, try to make sure your Christmas isn't spoiled by criminals. The advice below is common sense advice but easy to forget.

OUT SHOPPING: stay alert and be extra careful with your wallet or purse. Keep them close to your body and don't carry too much cash. The same applies if travelling on crowded buses or trains.

If you travel by car, park in a well-lit area, close the windows and lock all doors. Don't leave presents in view.

Always keep your bank card and cheque book separately. Never keep a note of your pin number with any of your credit/debit cards.

If you need to use an ATM (cash machine), try to use one inside a bank or store, or in a well-lit area. Be aware of who and what is close by. If the ATM looks as if it has been tampered with, do not use it (and report it to the bank or store). Never use an ATM if someone is using a mobile phone behind you, or nearby. (They could be saving your pin number on their phone). A safer option is to use a store that offers cash-back.

At home don't make it easy for burglars to steal those wonderful presents you're storing. Keep them out of sight until late on Christmas Eve and if you 'hide' or store larger items like bicycles in your shed or outbuildings, ensure they are very secure.

Check your insurance to make sure you are covered for the value of goods in your home.

Take the frame numbers of new cycles and the serial numbers of new electrical equipment for future reference. Remember, empty boxes left outside advertise that you have new goods inside so dispose of packaging carefully.

If you go out for the evening, close the curtains so it looks like someone is at home by turning on some lights and the radio. As a fire precaution, turn off the 'Christmas lights' and be extra careful about locking doors and windows.

If you go away for the holiday period use an automatic timer for lights



and ask a trusted neighbour to watch your home. Don't forget to cancel newspapers and milk if they are delivered, and either redirect your mail through the Post Office or ask your neighbour to take it in. Unopened mail is a sure sign that a house is empty.

Strangers at the door? Genuine delivery personnel usually have uniforms and liveried vehicles and shouldn't need to come into your home. Charity collectors will have identification and will not be offended if you ask to see it. If you are not sure but want to make a donation, ask about other ways, perhaps through a bank.

Out on the town at office parties and Christmas and New Year celebrations, pubs and other venues are often crowded.

Don't leave bags over the back of your chair. Keep wallets/purses close to your body to make it more difficult for the pickpocket.

- Busy places make it easier for a thief, so be alert at all times.
- Make prior arrangements for getting home perhaps nominate a 'designated driver.'

Avoid any potential disturbances on the street. Stay with friends if you can.

• Avoid the temptation to take a minicab on the street even when it's difficult to get a cab. It is illegal for minicabs to take passengers who have not pre-booked.

Make sure someone knows where you are going and what time you will be back.

Enjoy yourself but don't drink too much – you could become a target for thieves.

AS WE head into winter it's worth taking some time to think about how you might prepare for flooding. Loughton doesn't have a notable flood risk but there have been some isolated incidents in the past so it could happen. Remember, flood protection is the responsibility of the property owner so here are some things you might want to consider.

Preparation is easily the best course of action. If you live in a flood zone (check via

www.environment-agency.gov.uk/floodrisk) then make sure you sign up to the Environment Agency Floodline, an automated alerting system to warn you of imminent flooding. And keep an eye or ear on the weather forecasts.

Get some flood protection in place. Sandbags are okay but there are better solutions such as flood boards and air brick covers which you can quickly slip into place. Be aware that the District Council does not hold stocks of sandbags. Take a look at the National Flood Forum website for lots of advice and information.

Check your insurance cover and make sure you're covered for flooding and alternative accommodation. Keep important telephone numbers handy.

Check drains and gutters for blockages or damage. Make sure you know how to turn off your electricity, gas and water and keep a small 'emergency bag' handy in case you have to leave your property.

If you do experience flooding, try not to panic. Contact the Fire Service but be aware they may prioritise response where life is at risk. Move family members, pets and irreplaceable items such as photographs and documents upstairs. And remember that floodwater may be contaminated so try to avoid direct contact with it.

There is lots of information available on the internet so prepare now before the worst of the winter arrives.
