### 5 Town Clerk's / Chairman's Report

- The Highway Rangers have recently cleared the overgrown vegetation which obscured the road signage by the Lower Road / Englands Lane mini roundabout and have been thanked accordingly.
- The Evolis, Speed Indicator Device (SID) has been in place for some time now and the Speed Watch group are curently anlaysing the first full month's initial data.
- Environmental Sustainability Min no EH77 Councillor Fricker is working on a report that will be brought back to a future Environment and Heritage Committee meeting.
- Locality Fund Min no EH79. Unfortunately a suitable project could not be sourced. The Chairman and Town Clerk will provide futher input.
- Tree Whips Min no EH80 and Recreation Committee Min no RC79. Any surplus tree whips could be used along the border of Lady Whitakers Mead and Davenant Playing Fields.
- Litter along Sation Approach Min no EH81 refers. The Chairman has offered to make representation to Essex County Council (ECC).

### 6 Weekly Markets – Min no EH72

The Town Clerk will be expediting all paperwork, necessary to enable the weekly Sunday market to take place on the High Road, with initial emphasis on obtaining the Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) for the layby closure, working towards a projected June 2025 starting date.

### 7 Christmas Lights

The tender process cut-off date for the Christmas lights is 28 March 2025. To date there have been visits by eight respective companies, with actual tenders now awaited. This Committee is requested to nominate two members to assist the office (i.e. Town Clerk, Responsible Financial Officer (pending) and Services Manager) in choosing the best/appropriate tender for the three year contract, i.e. new lights to be installed December 2025. Traditionally the Chairman and and Vice Chairman are nominated for this panel. Members to agree the way forward.

### 8 Allotments - Willingale Road Allotments Report Current Situation

We have 1 full and 2 half plots currently vacant. Presently we do not have anyone on the waiting list. The next site inspection will take place in May 2025.

<u>Cesspit</u>

Officers are currently monitoring the level of water in the pit, (the water to the site remains turned off) the cesspit was emptied again on 18 February 2025, Officers have fitted a temporary lip around the access area to divert all rain/surface water. The level will be checked again in April at which time it will be apparent if the cess pit is taking in ground water.

### Allotment Provision at the Pyrles Lane site, Loughton

I refer to this site which is earmarked by Epping Forest District Council (EFDC) for housing development.

At a recent Town Council, Environment & Heritage Committee meeting, it was noted that there is a long waiting list for our existing Willingale Road Allotments. Members considered that allotment provision needs to be taken into consideration for this site.

The history of the site was relayed going back to 1947. On 6 January 1947, the Ministry of Agriculture Fisheries issued a Compulsory Purchase Order on the Pyrles Lane land, specifying it was to be used for the purposes of the Allotments Acts 1908 to 1925. To change the use of such land, a Certificate is needed from the Secretary of State.

Is there any evidence that this has been done and if not, it is most likely unlawful to build on the land?

I have been asked to query his aspect with EFDC and would appreciate your response on this matter.
