Cllr Murray declared a personal but non-prejudicial interest in this item as he was acquainted with officers of Loughton Athletic Club.

The Town Clerk reported that quotations for the refurbishment of the tennis court area, now including the installation of a multi sports court, were being collated. It was also NOTED that progress had been made with respect to the Loughton Athletic Club lease. The Committee AGREED with Cllr Murray's request to record in the minutes that there was no intention of a) enlarging the tennis court area to accommodate the multi sports court or b) to install floodlights.

The Committee AGREED to consider the use of fixed solid steel mesh barriers as an alternative to conventional tennis nets, which had been regularly vandalised, and reiterated its commitment to progressing this refurbishment of the tennis courts, including the running track facility to be installed by the Athletic Club, as a priority.

**RC66 Skateboard Park**

The Committee welcomed the Chairman's report of an offer of assistance from members of Epping Forest Youth Council to progress this project. The Town Clerk reported that visits to three of the town council owned sites would be arranged during the Easter school holidays to assess their suitability for a skateboard park and that all members would be invited to attend at a time and date to be advised.

The Committee NOTED the report and that the construction had been completed within budget.

**67.2 Grounds Maintenance**

The Committee NOTED the report and that improvement works would be carried out on fencing forming part of the boundary with 112 Borders Lane.
